Dear Friends

As we climb out of lockdown and re –engage in Sunday worship, may I make some observations for us all:

First, engaging with the Lord as we begin worship; many people, on arriving in their pew, do spend a few moments in private silent prayer, engaging with the presence of Jesus by His Holy Spirit. Personal preparation for worship is essential — bringing our worries, our pain, our unexpressed frustrations, thanks, praise, joy and sorrow before Him with whom we have to do, who knows all our weaknesses and our needs.


Second, being aware that others have needs and to be wise to spatially distance, whilst metaphorically giving others a hug or "virtual" handshake, engaging corporately with them as we approach the Lord in praise.

Third, to listen. Our temporary loss of congregational singing gives time to reflect on what inspires us: we are allowed choirs to lead us, and a "scratch choir" at some services, made up of those who can sing in tune and who can be appropriately distanced from each other in our church chancels can add a new dimension to meeting with the Lord – as well as saying hymns together, or different people reading a verse each – can enable congregational participation in new ways, using the words of a hymn to express our worship, praise, struggles, and hopes.

Forth, to give: of ourselves in worship and service, for it is not solely about the words, but our voices, our bodies as living sacrifices (Romans 12:1-2), our hands as offerings of peace and skill, and of our substance as we give to God what belongs to Him, and then more, as we remember that our lives do not consist in the abundance of our possessions, but of His possession of us.

The biggest obstacle to overcome as we move back into Sunday worship is fear. Many are fearful of catching the virus, or that by carelessness could unwittingly contribute to its spread; at the same time, risk assessments have to realistic, but that is dependent on assumptions too.

We all live just one heartbeat away from eternity, and He calls us to live in faith, not fear; in hope, not despair. "I sought the Lord and He answered me; He delivered me from all my fears." says Psalm 34:4. That does not mean that we live recklessly, but circumspectly, knowing one day we will all come to an end of our finite existence, but walking with assurance that we are His, and because Jesus rose from death to life, we have a living hope that trans-

cends the despair of this world and the ungodly system and culture within which we live.



- 1) At a meeting today, Dummer's M.P. Kit Malthouse confirmed that he and Basingstoke M.P. Maria Miller OPPOSE plans for a giant warehouse at

 Junction 7 of the M3.
- More than 200 letters objecting to the speculative development have been received by Basingstoke Council with more to come. Local Parish Councils will be sending in their objections soon. If you haven't written yet do it <u>now!</u> (ww.cleanairgreenenvironment.org)
- 1) In Swindon, the local council has set a precedent and a standard for
- 2) Basingstoke to follow. They have *turned down* a planning application for a science park citing many of the reasons (pollution, destruction of farmland, lack of benefits, substantial increases in traffic) that apply in the case of the proposed giant warehouse.
- 4) Campaigners are changing the name 'Basingstoke gateway' to Basingstoke Gatecrash" because it's uninvited, unwanted, and likely to cause trouble!

CAGE (cleanairgreenenvironment) continues to be working on understanding and preventing the environmental damage which will be caused if the distribution warehouses on junction 7 of the M3 get the go-ahead.

Jackie's County Corner

The 'It's Ok 'helpline will continue until March, operating from 9.30 to 4.30pm, 5 days a week. Calls are triaged. Anyone who is concerned about their situation- or that of a neighbour or friend is invited to call. Help includes prescriptions, meals on wheels, dementia concerns, family hunger, and tackling anxiety with practical support going out for the first time after lockdown. Call 0333 370 4000

I was horrified, and so sorry to hear of the terrible school bus crash at Headbourne Worthy: children from the Itchen Valley and the Worthys were on the bus. Some of the children were hurt, though thankfully, there were no fatalities. Many people have asked: 'what happens now'? The investigation will take about three months before any conclusions are published. All this happened in the first week of schools opening for all pupils, and in Hampshire, over 90% have returned. Parents who are concerned about sending children back or about the impact lockdown has had on their child's mental health can call the dedicated HCC Educational Psychologist helpline 01962 876239 (Tues & Thurs mornings)

Flooding: Flash flooding at the end of August brought 35 mm of rain in 25 minutes (according to HCC). Please report any blocked drains or road cleaning requirements through www. hants.gov.uk: go to roads and transport, then road defects, then report flooding. You can upload photos too.

The floods arrived so fast and so unexpectedly, no one authority could have reacted in time but one idea has been suggested by the emergency team: if you don't have a sandbag, you can keep a 'growbag' near your door. When the rains start pouring, use it to divert water away from your door or air bricks. It's not ideal, but a good start, and may hold the fort in a flash flood.

New bus routes from 1st September: Added stops on the 'free' bus to Tesco (Winnall) bus from Sutton Scotney, Stoke Charity and Wonston and Kings Worthy, a renewed call-and-go taxi service for East Stratton, and a new 95 bus route on a Monday and Thursday for East Stratton, Micheldever, Wonston and Worthys areas are now in operation. These are being trialled for six months to see how they go, despite the challenges of lockdown distancing.

There are two Government consultations:

Planning for the Future, deadline 29th October 2020. This is a fundamental change to the planning system, labelling land as 'growth, renew or protect'. The Govt. wants to increase housebuilding to 300,000 homes a year (currently permission given for 187500 a year), and so there is a second consultation:

Changes to the Current Planning System, deadline 1st October 2020, with proposals for a new algorithm that will result in more than 1000 homes a year for Winchester district.

I urge you (even if you're in the SDNP) to look carefully and respond to these consultations. The real changes are designed to strengthen influence of the Local Plan and reduce the emphasis on public consultation for individual planning applications.

Child Flu Clinics

We will also be contacting parents whose children are aged 2-3 (born 1.9.2016 – 31.8.2018) or aged 4-17 and have a condition which puts them at greater risk if they get flu. Children in years R-7 will be vaccinated in school by Schools Health. Please wait until you get an invitation letter before contacting the surgery.

Phlebotomy service (Blood tests) at Royal Hampshire County Hospital:

The phlebotomy service at Hampshire Hospitals on all sites changed to an appointment only service on Monday 23 March & is still currently in place. Appointment capacity has been increased as has the resource to answer calls and book appointments.

Walking with Wildlife

Field margins, blue with a cover crop of phacelia, have proved popular with bees, butterflies and hoverflies again this summer. A member of the borage family, phacelia, also known as blue or purple tansy, is often planted as part of a bee recovery programme to restore bumblebee habitats on arable farmland, as well as forming a green manure. Long-tongued bumblebees such as the garden bumblebee benefit the most. With a long flowering period, an entire field of scented phacelia, lavender blue in bright sunlight, is quite an impressive sight.

On the sunny side of grassy verges in late summer, the yellow snapdragons of common toadflax are blooming and will last well in to the autumn. The sturdy flowers, the colour of scrambled eggs, have acquired all manner of folk-names over the years from butter-and-eggs to bunny-mouths. A native perennial it is widely cultivated as a garden plant. The tall spires of its cousin, purple toadflax, introduced long ago in the 17th century from Italy, are now naturalised and popular with ladybirds, bees and bumblebees.

Returning from Micheldever Woods one day, I found hiding in plain sight on the grassy verge near Hassock Copse another late summer delight: a giant puffball. The chalk-white mound, a pan-sized breakfast treat for some when freshly sliced, was now grooved and furrowed, sculpted into a fungal artwork by feasting slugs.

Giant puffballs can be quite elusive; common in some years, rare in others. Found in fields, paddocks and hedgerows, they favour soils rich in manure, compost heaps and nettle beds. One afternoon I searched in vain beyond the churchyard walls at St. John's, Northington – a well-known site in previous years.

However, there were other compensations: looking up I saw the skies were suddenly full of a throng of house martins and swallows, a fascinating display of some hundred or so excited birds. They seemed restless for migration, swirling around the village rooftops, settling briefly to perch in rows on the power line, before taking off to swoop fast and low over the water-meadows, chasing insects.

Dear residents

I start this month with an appeal for information about three burglaries, two of which are houses, in our area. For the first eight months of the year we experienced no reported house burglaries across the whole of my 75 sq. mile area, unfortunately that has not lasted.

The first was between August 15 and 16 at a barn behind the Woolpack public house at Totford. I am pleased to report we have forensic evidence however if anyone has any information that can assist please give me a call direct. The second was between August 21 and 31 2020 at a house in Dummer Road, Axford, and the third at a house in Chilton Candover overnight between September 1 and 2.

In both the dwelling burglaries a substantial amount of property was stolen and I continue to urge all residents to photograph and record details of valuable property and items.

On August 20 theft from a garden at Chilton Candover took place where two lead planters was stolen. Slightly further afield in Upton Grey overnight of August 16 and 17 a large amount of stone was stolen from a garden in Basingstoke Road. Whilst during the day on Monday September 7 between 11:58 AM and 12:05 PM an ornate ceramic bird bath was stolen from a garden in Cliddesden. A silver car was seen to enter and stop outside the garden and then drove away a short time afterwards. As with property at home, I ask residents to please remain vigilant, photograph and mark valuable items.

As the evenings draw in please consider your home security, leave lights on and use timers, consider an alarm and CCTV, leave a radio/television on, please make the appearance that someone is at home, consider 'Beware of the Dog' signs on the front gate, again it all helps to prevent burglary.



Summary

Apart from a couple of light showers, the first week and a half was dry and sunny with temperatures rising to well above normal. The warmest day at $94^{\circ}F$ was recorded on the 12^{th} when there was distant thunder, and more the following day with lightning and almost $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches of rain. The next two days provided remarkable contrast with thick, featureless cloud. Almost two weeks of unsettled weather followed, with the odd rumble of thunder, showers or longer outbreaks of rain and a few sunny spells. It was breezy on the 21^{st} and 25^{th} and although spared the worst of storms Ellen and Francis, over $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches of rain on the 27^{th} caused flash flooding across the region. The month ended with an autumnal feel as temperatures declined. Overall, the temperature was well above the norm and it was the wettest August on record, with 230% of the usual rainfall. The summer was slightly warmer and wetter than normal.

On the Farm — Julian Gibbons

Harvest finally finished on the 8th September with the last of the spring sown winter beans. A lot has appeared in the press about the cereal harvest this year and its effects on food prices. We have three empty sheds that would normally have grain in then. This is the result of a combination of lower yields and spring crops that are lower yielding by nature. The quality of harvest was generally good. Our Maris Otter winter barley is better than last year, although lower yielding. Wheat was about 10% down in yield, but quality good. The spring oats, which I said last year we would never grow again, were low yielding and poor quality. They were affected by the wet weather in the second half of August, with quite a bit of grain shed in the field. Beans were generally about 40% down on yield, although one field did come in on budget. The challenge is identifying why it yielded better.

The one bright spot were the peas. They looked good from the moment they emerged in April and never looked back. Brother reckoned they were one of the best crops he had ever combined, which is unusual for peas. They came in 25% over budget with a beautiful sample. It is typical that in a year with no Hay, Corn and Root Shows we produce the best sample of peas ever! Our grain drier also had no use this year.

This year the UK will be an importer of wheat. Prices have risen to reflect the small crop. This time last year feed wheat was £120/t for September delivery, this year it is £170/t. Milling premiums have risen as well. This sounds a bonanza, but we have only 20% of what we produced last year. Warnings have been made about the effect on bread prices, however the wheat price is only about 11% of the price of a loaf. If the price of wheat doubles it will only result in a 5-6p price rise on a standard 800g loaf. We are now getting ready to start autumn planting. We have put some green cover crops in and we are trying a different mix this year. We have Ben Robinson's sheep eating through one fodder radish cover crop that will be going into wheat once they have finished. We have not planted any oilseed rape this year, we found it too depressing to establish a crop and then watch it die over the winter and early spring due to a pest we con no longer control.

The Sugar Beet crop in East Anglia has been affected terribly by an aphid spread virus. The aphids are resistant to all the sprays and we no longer have the use of neonicotinoid seed dressings and sprays, which controlled them. Beet virus yellows are so bad in France that they anticipate the yield could be down by as much as 70%. The French who were instrumental in getting the Neonicotinoid ban will probably give an emergency use next year to try and save their sugar beet industry from complete collapse. The recent mild winters have meant higher pest numbers, oh for a cold winter

Aphids spread Barley Yellow Dwarf virus in cereals, so we are being encouraged to delay drilling to reduce the risk of spread. The problem is that after last year we need to get crops in the ground and we have to balance the risk of disease and increased weeds against the risk of not planting. Over the last 40 years our rolling 5 year average rainfall figure has been on a steady upward progression and we have fewer days to plant winter cereal then we used to have.

Our wild bird strips are a mixed bunch, but some seem to have all the sunflowers. This is I think due to the seed shaking down in the seed box and separating according to seed size. They are giving a bright look to the farm for September.



From Winchester's MP

Parliament is back in full swing now and, without a conference season this year, it's a long session through until Christmas. Using my decade plus experience, I have been speaking out in recent weeks; of my concerns for the future of many **health prevention** duties within the remit of the soon to be disbanded Public Health England, on access to **Covid testing** and that important **UK/EU free trade agreement**.

I also spoke recently in a major debate on aviation and focused on two things; the shameful way British Airways have turned a health crisis in an industrial relations catastrophe and **sustainable air travel** as we chase our climate change objectives through the 'jet zero' programme. It should never be either or and we shouldn't listen to the negative mindset that says otherwise. You can find the speech linked from my Facebook page.

Recent weeks have, of course, been dominated by the awful events around the **school bus crash in Kings Worthy**. For those who don't know, that bus comes through Alresford and picks up young people in the Itchen Valley and we can only thank God noone was killed as it struck the railway bridge on Wellhouse Lane on its way to Henry Beaufort School.

Speaking on the local TV news, I said at the time how we need clear answers as to how this could ever have happened and, notwithstanding the police operation which must take its proper course, I haven't wasted time in this regard. The school, police, council and Stagecoach were round a table with me within days of the incident and now know how upset and angry residents are.

There is no doubt (or argument) that this bus was on the wrong route but we need to know why. As importantly for us, there are clearly issues with the timetabling of this service out in the Itchen Valley and I want a speedy resolution to them because my hunch is they're symptomatic of a home school transport contract that has been found seriously wanting. This is a fast-moving situation, and subject to various legal action, but I will keep all updated as best I can via my usual channels.

Finally, I passionately believe **Winchester has a unique opportunity** to become a real work-place destination in the wake of covid and changing work patterns. The question is do we have the local leadership, the ambition and the vision to grab this opportunity?

In my recent column, published in the *Hampshire Chronicle*, I argue that the challenges facing Winchester's economy and continued dither over its' regeneration have been badly exposed by the pandemic. My central thesis is that Winchester can no longer afford to indulge in endless debate and self-interested legal challenge because this is all connected to the changing workplace; we should have a bold strategy to be an exciting workplace destination and build an economic powerhouse that can fund the public services and cultural offering we so value.
