#### Dear Friends

As spring is in the air, and snowdrops are bursting out, hopes rise for a better year ahead after so much trauma and fear.

As we look forward to each new day as a gift of God (remember God's present is God presence with us now), it is time to look away from what is thrown at us hour after hour in the media, and start looking up to the Lord who loves us and is with us. A colleague shared that last year when the epidemic was rising so fast, as he left to go on a prayer walk in the city where he lives, his first overwhelming experience was a wave of fear. Then, as he paused, he said he heard as distinctly as he had ever heard, the voice of God speaking quietly to him: "Where is your faith? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to your life?"(Luke 8:25, Matthew 6:27).Or, The Message "why can't you trust me?"

This virus has brought an attack on our minds as well as our bodies: listening to the media can condition us into thinking that God doesn't care; but He does. If we believe that God exists, that He rewards those who earnestly seek him (Hebrews 11:6), and that He loves us and is in us because we invited him, why would we choose fear instead of faith? Either we do trust Him or we don't; if we do, we will look into His glorious face, marvel at His promises to us, and relax and choose to trust that He is with us through this storm. And even if we succumb to this or to any other illness that befalls us, we have our citizenship in heaven, which is our destination, so why spend hours worrying about what may not happen, and knowing where we are head-ed?

A word for this time I think is "**endurance**": many of us have had to endure all sorts of things in life's journey, and Jesus has been with us all the time, whether we recognise Him or not. When our lives are undergirded with His Word and His promises, we are called to persevere. Enduring hardship is part of life: we have a Saviour who endured the cross, who was raised from the dead who lives now and is in us; and the Holy Spirit within us gives us the power to keep going, to keep looking up, and to <u>choose faith not fear.</u>

Sometimes I have found myself assailed at night in my dreams or sleeping lightly, and had doubts coming at me like arrows; I have learned to praise the Lord, and worship him, even in those semi-conscious moments, and as time has passed, as soon as those attacks arise, it is easier to praise Him because that is my "default" – and the peace comes. That has been so particularly in these last 12 months, but the secret is always, to set my mind on things that are above, where Christ is seated, at the right hand of God. We all have choices to make – choosing faith, not fear, and realising this is a long haul, but an hour at a time, where we can sink or choose to rise above the "slough of despond" as John Bunyan put it in "Pilgrim's Progress," through trusting Jesus.

The next few weeks, we will continue to have our Sunday worship online, until the situation improves and we are able to meet together to worship – we have published

our February worship rota without the service times, but at least you all have the Sunday Bible readings and possible sermon titles; and should the miracle happen and the virus die away – as they do – the usual pattern will re-commence and we will get the information to you quickly.

Lent is almost upon us, and elsewhere we are publishing what we are going to do online for you all – we hope a lot of you will join in on "Zoom." Do not worry... do not fear... God is with us.


Our next course is now booking, and due to start in early February on Zoom – both daytime and evenings are possible depending on numbers and



If you are in a priority group 1-4 & are willing to travel to one of the mass vaccination centres, then please visit; https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/ coronavirus-vaccination/book-coronavirus-vaccination/ to organise a booking via the National programme.

We are doing this in priority order ONLY - See below :

T1. Residents in care home for older adults

Staff working in care homes for older adults.

2. All those 80 years and over.

Frontline Health and social care workers.

3. All those 75 years of age and over.

4. All those 70 years and over.

Clinically extremely vulnerable individuals (not including pregnant women and those less than 16 years of age)

5. All those 65 years of age and over.

6. Adults age 16 to 65 years of age in an at risk group.

7. Adults age 55 years of age and over.

8. All those 50 years and over.

**Please do not call us** – we have strict guidelines for eligibility & we are already overwhelmed.

This will be a long process taking many months but we are delighted to have made a start.

To keep you as informed as possible, we will update these messages frequently as we become aware of more information from NHS England:

Some hospitals have now received the Pfizer/BioNTech Covid vaccine and are starting to invite patients in for their vaccine

Some GP practices have received the Pfizer/BioNTech Covid vaccine and are inviting patients in for their vaccine.

We will let you know the specific local Covid vaccination plans as soon as we can. We will contact you individually if and when you are invited to have a vaccine and will keep this website updated.



Heading over to Kites Hill, Totford for a brisk ramble, the row of beech trees lining the roadside were white with layers of hoar frost, while the valley below was completely cloaked by fog.

The lone yew trees of Totford Down, sentinels of the upper hillside, were just shadows in the mist as we set off, well wrapped up, along the Wayfarer's Walk towards Brown Candover.

The familiar trail was now a frozen world of frosty hedgerows, here and there aglow with rose hips. Ice sculptures of hogweed decorated the verges. Foraging parties of redwings roamed the treetops, while blackbirds clattered from the hedge depths. From the distant fogbanks came the constant chatter of fieldfares and the croaking of rooks. Woodpigeons sat in well-spaced rows along the power lines. A red kite floated effortlessly over the sheep pastures of the valley bottom. Rows of fresh molehills criss-crossed the grasslands as the males begin their search for springtime mates.

The Candover Brook, steaming in the chill air, ran fast and clear, a winterbourne now in full spate. Pairs of mallard ducks, wings beating frantically, headed down the mist filled valley.

Reaching the junction with Bryces or Duck Lane, we turned left into Copse Lane, a tree-lined trackway that leads up to the intriguingly named Burnt House Copse. The chalky banks of this hillside byway were riddled with rabbit burrows. Wrens flickered through the hedge bottoms, while dunnocks broke cover to fly ahead of us. Dense thickets of dogwood stems, red as dying embers, stood out in the misty half-light.

From the top of this path there are usually fine views over the valley, but on this morning all was shrouded in a haze of drifting fog. As we tramped back retracing our path, the frost abruptly vanished, leaving sparkling ice crystals to patter down from the trees.

fell from 5 to 2, the lowest recorded since 2014. Interestingly as assaults increased from 21 in 2019 to 31 in 2020, most were of a domestic nature.

Crimes such as Harassment, Blackmail etc. are deemed as 'Other Crimes. Those involving theft of/from vehicles are recorded as Vehicle Crime – (VC). The breakdown shows that seven parishes saw an increase in reported crime; eleven saw a decrease and four had the same number in both years.

Finally I have had a further reported incident of sheep worrying, this time at Winslade. A dog, off the lead, was found chasing sheep and bit into several causing one 10-month-old lamb a considerable wound requiring treatment.

Further action is underway against the owner and person in charge of the dog at the time. May I yet again warn *all owners* of dogs to please keep your dog under proper control and ideally on a lead when near farm livestock.

With the current lock down in place people are walking more with their dogs which is good, but yet again and this is the third time I have had to deal with a sheep worrying incident in also as many months, keep your dog under control. Please keep to designated footpaths, enjoy the countryside but follow the Countryside Code. Please also remember if a dog is found worrying livestock on agricultural land the farmers do have a lawful right to shoot that dog, please do not put you, your dog or the farmers in that position.

Dear residents


As is customary I will update you with the state of crime reported in each of the parishes in the area of this magazine for 2020, however before doing so I wish to update you on a series of crimes that have taken place in the nearby parish of Herriard.

On January 7 2021 at lunchtime a white Ford Transit tipper registration MK08 OUH was seen in Bagmore Lane where the driver was seen to call on houses asking about scrap metal. Along with having a good look at houses, he also asked who owned a van parked nearby and about local wood yard premises. Later that morning at 3 am a vehicle was heard near the same cottages, when disturbed by a resident the vehicle made off, however later that day (8<sup>th</sup>) I had a report that outbuildings had been broken into at two premises in that area.

In addition, on the 7<sup>th</sup> a resident of Tunworth heard someone on his driveway and he looked and challenged two men who ran off. From my enquiries, I have established that a silver Honda CRV vehicle registration BD51 CWK was seen in the area at that time. Two hours later Police chased it from the scene of a farm burglary at Selbourne, Alton. I continue to urge all residents to remain vigilant and keep your property secured. It is vital that you report any suspicious incidents.

If you see either of these vehicles listed above, please let me know immediately.

The area in which I write is that of my former area, which covered twentytwo parishes and is of 75 sq miles, you may recall that as of 2014 my area increased considerably to cover as far as the Andover border. Now, back to 2020 where generally crime fell across the area, this was due to COVID and the initial lock down; we know this as prior to March crime was rising in every month on the same period in 2019. The highest reported crime of 2020 was that of criminal damage (CD) which was mainly fields of growing crops and farm property damaged by poachers. Of burglary offences we had 62 sheds, garages and other outbuildings (Non Dwelling Burglaries – NDB), broken into, a reduction of 17 on the 2019 figures. House burglary, incidents

None of us wanted to be here. This new strain of COVID-19 is spreading rapidly across all parts of the country though and – following scientific advice – HM Government took the difficult decision that it is safer to close down schools until it is under control.

My wife and I – like many of you – are juggling home schooling my two daughters whilst keeping up our usual work schedules – so I wholeheartedly understand the challenges this decision presents parents with.

Throughout the pandemic, children's education has been a key priority for me. As part of the government's commitment that no child is left behind, I am pleased to confirm that a million laptops and tablets will be delivered to schools across the country, for those who need them. To date, over 560,000 devices have been delivered to councils in England, with our students here in Hampshire benefitting from well over 1,500 devices. This – backed up by the distribution of over 54,000 4G Wi-Fi routers and updated remote education requirements for schools – means children should now be benefitting from hours of high-quality remote learning a day.

This crisis is unprecedented, as is the vaccination programme we are seeing rolled out across the United Kingdom. It is the largest our country has ever seen and the Prime Minister's announcement that 15 million people – the over-70s, healthcare workers and those required to shield – should have been offered a vaccination by mid-February shows the vast scale to which our NHS is working. So far, we have vaccinated more people in the Britain than in any other European country.

We are beating this deadly virus back and we will get there before long. We have all sacrificed so much so far - but the day is darkest before the dawn.



#### Summary

Cloud thickened to give dull conditions after fine weather on the first day of the month, with spells of rain and increasingly cold temperatures. The unsettled weather continued though it was milder for two weeks from the  $10^{\text{th}}$ , with predominantly south to south-westerly winds which brought showers and longer outbreaks of rain. The temperatures dropped in the last eight days with unbroken sunshine on the  $25^{\text{th}}$  before wet and windy weather overnight on  $26^{\text{th}}/27^{\text{th}}$  as Storm Bella passed through. There was a light snow shower on the  $29^{\text{th}}$ . It remained at or below freezing on the last day of the year with fog descending and the coldest night at  $23^{\circ}$ F. Overall, the month was cooler and wetter than normal.





Lesley Rose, Advice Services Manager for Citizens Advice Winchester District, shares her advice on how to manage debt.

# I've fallen behind on my bills and the debts are building up, especially after Christmas. I don't know where to start?

You've already taken a great first step by asking for help, and it's important to know you don't need to face this alone. Your local Citizens Advice can help you make a plan to manage your debt but in the meantime here are four steps you can take to get started:

1. Work out how much you owe - Make a list of whom you owe money to and add up how much you need to pay each month. If you don't have your most recent statements, contact your creditor to find out what you owe. Some creditors will have special arrangements for people with Covid-related arrears.

2. **Prioritise your debts** - Your rent or mortgage, energy and council tax are called priority debts as there can be serious consequences if you don't pay them. Separate these and work out how much you owe. Again, you can ask the companies or council what support might be available during the pandemic.

3. **Work out how much you can pay** - Create a budget by adding up your essential living costs, such as food and housing, and taking these away from your income. Citizens Advice has a budgeting tool that can help (www.citizensadvice.org.uk).

4. Any money you have spare can be put towards your debts, starting with the priority debts first. If you have any money left after paying priority debts, but not enough to make your usual payments on other debts, consider getting advice on the best way for you to start getting on top of them.

5. If you can't pay your debts - If you've got little or no money spare to pay your priority debts or if you're struggling to pay for basics like food, seek advice from Citizens Advice straight away.

We know it can feel very daunting to deal with debt, but having a plan really helps and our team will be here to help you each step of the way.

# On the Farm—Julian Gibbons

The cold weather at the beginning of the year has hopefully killed some insects off. We are being told that climate change will mean that we are less likely to see long periods of cold in the future. The cold is our most useful tool and insects, crop diseases and frost susceptible weeds haven't become resistant to it yet. The spring beans that have come up in the succeeding wheat, do not look quite as health as they did before the frosts. Just a few more frost should hopefully kill them off There has been quite a bit in the papers about the government allowing the now banned neonicotinoid seed dressings to be allowed, under certain circumstances, in this year's sugar beet crop.

Sugar beet is susceptible to an aphid spread disease called Beet Virus Yellows. We no longer have any control method, because the aphids that spread it are resistant to the limited sprays we have left. The harvest that has been lifted this autumn/winter is down by 25% due to Virus Yellows, and some growers have seen their harvest drop by us much as 75%. This isn't a problem just for the UK. In France the yield drop has been much greater and having been the first country in Europe to ban Neonico-tinoids, they have already stated that they will allow their use to try and save their crop.

In the UK their use will be determined by independent forecasting from aphid trapping and the subsequent analysis for the virus. Use will be determined by actual threat.

Sugar Beet is an incredibly important crop in the areas where it is grown and particularly for small family arable farms.

Just before Christmas we got sent the results for the past 12 months for the solar array on the farm.

It generated: 10,264 MWh against a target of 9597MWh

On typical domestic consumption this equivalent to powering: 3110 households Tonnes of CO2 saved: 4413.

Unfortunately I cannot use these figures when calculating our farm carbon footprint. We are trying to produce our farm figures so that we can start to look at what we can do to reduce it in-line with the NFU pledge to be carbon neutral by 2040. This isn't that all farms will be carbon neutral by then, some will struggle and some will do better than neutral, but the industry will be neutral.

We have to go through all our fuel use, fertiliser use (type and quantity), pesticides, machinery used, energy embedded in our buildings (after 10 years they are deemed to have covered it) just to name a few. We can then start to compare ours against others to see what we can do to improve it. I think the first year is going to be a bit of a slog collating the data, but it should get better in subsequent years.

It will get interesting comparing the carbon merits of building a new grain store on your farm, to sending it to the co-operative store at Micheldever, which involves extra transport. Generally when one looks at carbon in the food chain, transport accounts for the smallest part.

All the spring seed arrived on the farm last month, all we need now are some cold, dry easterly winds to dry the ground ready for planting that could begin to start later this month on the lighter land.



As you read this, February edition of **Oxdrove**, we remain in lockdown and 2021 is

starting to look at lot like 2020.

The difference, and the reason I could support lockdown #3 in the House, is we finally have the ultimate escape from the deadly cycle of lockdown and release in the form of a **COVID vaccine**. I have spoken regularly in Parliament on the subject and am liaising with Ministers to help our area play its part and support the national effort. Furthermore, I have been doing my bit locally to help in a more practical way so when it's your turn to jab for victory keep your eyes peeled for a friendly and familiar face.

While this is good news it remains my strong belief that these odious restrictions on our lives must not be in place a day longer than required. Alongside the published vaccine delivery plan – and daily figures on how we're getting covid done – we must give the public hope.

Around 88% of those likely to get seriously unwell (and sadly die) reside within the top four priority vaccine groups. Given the only metric that really counts, and the reason why public support for lockdown is so high is the desire to prevent the NHS from being overwhelmed, logic would dictate that once that threat has gone away we can start to lift restrictions.

We need clear heads if we want to do that. Covid-19 is not a conspiracy and it is not a hoax. We were right to take it seriously last spring, and since, but we are equally right to demand a plan that dismantles the most draconian of laws in lock-step with the vaccination programme.

The plan commits Government to vaccine the top four group by 15<sup>th</sup> February so this really is a game-changer. My old colleague, Chris Whitty, grimly reminds us that we expect between 7,000 and 10,000 deaths from flu each in an average year and the most cautious reading would suggest the vaccination programme should take Covid deaths well below this level.

So when we have vaccinated the highest risk groups, what will we do? And when we've completed phase one by vaccinating all those with above-average risk in late March, what will we do then?

These are important questions and ones I and my colleagues will be asking. It won't happen unless we do, of that I am very certain.

We do not lock society down for commons colds, seasonal flu and we cannot (no matter how awful it can be) for the little understood condition that is Long Covid. The many other economic, health and societal impacts of this pandemic are already serious enough so we need a roadmap out of this the public can believe in or this year is going to make the last look tame by comparison.
