Dear Friends


On May 23rd we celebrated Pentecost, 50 days after Easter, when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the disciples as they waited and prayed; Jesus promised that He and His Father would fulfil what had been promised through the prophets, that God himself would come and reside inside anyone who invited Him to come. This meant moving from the idea that God dwelt in a place – in the Temple at Jerusalem – to realising we are all temples of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 6:19-20:"Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honour God with your bodies.")

That's why when Jesus takes up residence within us, He starts the process of making us more like Himself from the inside. With Him living in us, it is a reminder that when God created human beings He breathed on them to give life; the word for breath, wind or Spirit is the same in Hebrew —ruach— and in Greek it is the same — Pneuma— from which we get the word to describe our car tyres for they are pneumatic—full of wind, spirit or breath.

When a person dies, it is said they "give up the spirit" – in older language "give up the ghost" – the life, the breath, departs.

Sometimes people are described to be so alive that they are "full of spirit" – energy, life, inspiration, and enthusiasm – this word comes from "possessed by or inspired by God." Some of the newer converts through the centuries who came to Christ were derogatorily called "enthusiasts" because they were inspired by their faith in Jesus. Nothing wrong being enthusiastic – unless it becomes a bit "over the top" as some are described. Romans 12:11 says: "Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervour, serving the Lord." The RSV translates it, "be aglow with the Spirit." I've met people who "glowed" with the divine presence – in the Old Testament Moses, whenever he went into the presence of God to pray and worship would return with a face so aglow that he had to wear a veil (yep, one of the few times mask wearing was needed in the Bible!) because the people were afraid of that glow, which comes from living in the presence of the Holy One of God.

What is it that attracts people to Jesus? Seeing people filled with Jesus and doing the stuff of Jesus – living and doing what Jesus said – truth, love, compassion, care, unruffled, willing to work with the worst as well as the best in society to bring change for the better. How do we get filled with Jesus? Read Acts 2 where the Holy Spirit came to the disciples and began that "glowing" within them.





My recent updates have focused on our local response to the pandemic, but it's right that this not be the only show in town. Residents of both Bradley and the Candovers are lucky to live in and alongside some beautiful countryside, which folk love to walk and bicycle through – especially over the last year – and we can all play a part in 'Our Plan' for local services that keep us greener, cleaner and safer.

For example, Hampshire County Council recently committed half a million pounds to restore and improve local footpaths. So, if there's a much-used country path near Bradley or the Candovers in need of improvement, or a beloved trail damaged by one of the wettest winters on record, do report it at: bit.ly/footpathrepairs

And, just a quick reminder, you can have your say on my suggestion of a "North Hampshire Cycle Network" at ranil.uk/cycling – and see the latest thinking on which particular route might be deliverable first.

Sadly, not everyone respects our environment – and fly-tipping is a crime which blights communities across the country. It's particularly unacceptable here, given the free household waste disposal at Hampshire's network of Household Waste Recycling Centres – a cost-effective option open to small businesses too. You'll be pleased to know that over 100 people have been successfully prosecuted and 116 fixed penalty notices issued across Hampshire since 2018, while prosecutions nationally have more than doubled since 2016. As a result, we almost saw fly-tipping in Hampshire decrease for the seventh consecutive year – but for a single organised crime gang that shockingly dumped 30 tonnes of waste around Hampshire! This proves how lucrative fly-tipping can be for organised criminal gangs, and shows that, as ever, there's more to do.

That's why the government continues to make sure local authorities have the powers they need, including: fines of up to £400; enhanced powers to search and seize vehicles of suspected fly-tippers; Magistrates' Court fines of up to £50,000 or twelve months imprisonment; and unlimited Crown Court fines or five year sentences. Work is underway to increase Magistrates' awareness of the prevalence and importance of waste crime too, whilst the Environment Bill will make it easier for officers to search premises to seize evidence and make sure that fines can be revised if needed.

Our local councils do act, and that's why it's promising that recent figures show a ten per cent increase in community reports across Hampshire, but please do report anything you see around Bradley, the Candovers and beyond too!

Walking with Wildlife

The swifts were back sweeping over the rooftops of Broad Street in Alresford. Swallows too had returned but where were the house martins? The cool spring with its frosty mornings and brisk northerly breezes seemed to have delayed their return.

We were down at the far end of Avington Park, near Itchen Abbas, visiting the Hampshire Countryside grassland site, with its fine views across the lake to Avington House. Dainty little black and white ducks with golden eyes were bobbing about on the water in bright sunshine. These were male tufted ducks. In profile the drakes displayed a floppy, slicked back head crest – the tuft. In contrast the females were brown with only a hint of a tuft. A red kite appeared, floating over the tree-tops and beneath it, to our delight, the familiar profile of a house martin – our first sighting of the season. Four more martins drifted over, gliding in from the south, with barely a flicker of their pointed wings.

Heading on, we followed the lane, before taking the footpath across the damp pastures of the valley bottom to Chilland. Here beside the River Itchen, bright gold with kingcups or marsh marigolds, we paused to listen to the chanting calls of chiffchaffs hidden in the willow canopies above. Swallows and house martins swooped fast and low, hunting for insects over the river and water meadows. They seemed to be biding their time, feeding in the shelter of the valley wetlands before returning to their downland haunts to nest and breed.

Far away at Preston Oak Hills, the bluebells were in full bloom mingling with the white stars of greater stitchwort and the unfurling fronds of ferns. The sight and scents of a bluebell wood ringing with birdsong was quite enchanting. Clumps of yellow archangel, arching stems of Solomon's seal and patches of wood-sorrel lined the wayside path. The oaks had flushed an olive green, their twigs mossy with clusters of leaves and catkins. Oak before ash in for a splash, runs the old saying, perhaps predicting a dry summer.



On the Farm—Julian Gibbons

As I write this in the middle of May, it is a wet Sunday evening with a forecast for a cluttery week of weather. This follows the coldest and one of the driest April's we have experienced. By the time it started to rain the winter crops weren't actually short of moisture, but they were short of nutrients.

The fertiliser was all on the surface waiting for rain to wash it in. Rain in May is like liquid gold, very precious at building yield and within a week of it starting to rain the wheat darkened as it picked up its nitrogen. The cold April meant the crops were slow to move through growth stages; warmer nights and rain heralded a rush through their growth stages in days and the last leaf on the wheat (the flag leaf) is now poking through. The dry April meant most disease was kept back, allowing us to make savings on fungicides. We have cut one spray out completely and reduced rates on the next spray. This also reflects that we are growing more resistant varieties.

Nearly all the nitrogen is on all the crops, we just have final amounts on the milling wheat to boost the grain protein to make the contract specification of 13%. We will probably try a foliar feed, that although three times the price of using solid fertiliser, is supposed to be much more efficient, so requiring much less nitrogen. This is good for carbon accounting, because nitrogen fertiliser is our biggest source of CO2 emissions, but it needs to be seen that it is good for our bottom line.

Grain prices are very buoyant. Feed wheat, if you have any left, is worth over £200/ tonne. Milling wheat however is harder to sell, because the millers have imported so much. We sold our milling wheat in February, but the earliest we could get a delivery slot was for July. The November futures price, although less then old crop, has risen by £28/tonne in the last three months. New crop rapeseed has hit levels we have never seen at around £450 + oil bonuses for November delivery. Poor harvests, global weather uncertainties and China being very active buying grain have pushed prices up.. The UK will finish the season with grain stores nearly empty and the area of rape has plummeted we now are a net importer. Those growers who bravely planted rape last August will now be very pleased with themselves.

On the farm, we have 12 hectares of wild bird covers to put in. Last year's were very weedy and stifled the actual crop out. We have gone back to tried and trusted mixtures that we have more options for weed control. This will mean much better seed production for the winter. We have put some poultry muck that came from the poultry unit in Preston Candover on the strips and incorporated it within a couple of hours. This should supply most of the fertiliser required for the season. One of the seed mixes we will use has sunflowers in it and hopefully the sunflowers will not all go on the first drilled strip as they appeared to last year.

New telephone system

We began using a new telephone system at the end of April because our previous system meant we had a limited number of lines & when busy we did not have enough lines for patients to get through to us.

We had received feedback from patients about having a system with a queue function so that is what we have invested in.

The new system now means we have the function for training & monitoring of calls. It allows us to have additional recorded patient messages, call options & a call queue facility.

The queue is set up to allow up to 15 people in a queue at one time, when the queue is full a message is given to ask the patient to call back to prevent excessively long wait times.

All GP's now have a dedicated line to call out, so there are no issues when contacting patients for telephone consultations.

To give you an idea of the number of calls we receive we have got some call stats for you;

Week commencing 26th April; 1183 -Calls received. 24 minutes & 28 second - Longest answer time. - 3 minutes 2 seconds - Average answer time. - 2 minutes & 2 seconds - Average talk time.

Patients can expect a longer wait time daily, between 8.30-9.30, which is when we receive the highest number of calls.

We can now monitor our telephone system & can make informed decisions on staffing. These telephone stats will be reviewed regularly.

We are aware that some patients would like to know where they are in the queue, we have been in contact with the phone company & unfortunately this function is currently unavailable to us.



Summary

There was a cold start to the month with temperatures well below the seasonal norm and snow flurries on the 6th. Further snow fell overnight on the 11th which left a scattering on the ground. High pressure then provided stable conditions for two weeks with plenty of sunshine, unbroken on several days towards the end of this period, warmer daytime temperatures but more overnight frosts. Rain on the 28th brought to an end, a record 32 days without measureable rainfall. It was the third driest April and the cumulative rainfall for the year to date is a third down on the long term average. This was the coldest April in over 20 years, with more than three times the average number of frosts, and colder than the preceding month for the first time since 2012.

First of all this month, I want to touch on the subject of **illegal traveller racing** over on the A33.

I deliberately put it in those terms because that's what it is. And, yes, I appreciate it's difficult for the police – and we should try to respect other cultures – but not when they break the law of the land.

As I promised at the time, I have been speaking (pretty frankly) to the police and the robust new Police Commissioner, Donna Jones, since the events of May's early Bank Holiday weekend, and supporting their efforts to escalate the response for any future races. This is extremely pressing given adverts for a race at "Mitchell Diva" have been circulating on social media and I am pleased to say, as a result of what happened last month and the numbers involved, the weekend in June has been escalated to a Public Order Public Safety event. A silver commander officer has been identified who will write up a tactical and strategic plan.

And I will be leading the calls from constituents – coordinating your elected representatives at all levels – to meet these plans with a show of strength that makes it very clear the A33 is not a race track and we do not want this here. Clearly it's a fast –moving situation but I will endeavour to post updates via the Parish Council and on my Facebook page.

Secondly, it was a welcome return at the end of May for my **ASKtheNHS** series of public meetings. This one heard from Hampshire Hospitals Foundation Trust – and local commissioners – about future services at the Royal Hampshire County Hospital in Winchester and plans for a new build hospital near (possibly) Junction 7 of the M3. On a different subject altogether, I recently joined officers from the **British Transport Police** at Winchester station as they carried out an important "county lines" operation. I was taken through the work of the team in combatting the practice which brings drugs into our area from big cities including London.

After ten years in public life, I am not easily shocked by things but it never ceases to amaze me what I hear. Drug running into places like Winchester is a menace which prays on the most vulnerable and the BTP team are doing superb work to try and disrupt it. It is so important that the police are tough and out showing a strong, but supportive, face.

Finally, many congratulations to **Cllr Fiona Isaacs** for her **election to Winchester City Council** representing the Alresford & Itchen Valley Ward and to Cllr Porter for her re-election as County Councillor. I will, as always, work with them both for the benefit of my constituents in this lovely part of my patch.

Lesley Rose, Advice Services Manager for Citizens Advice Winchester District gives advice on how to choose a local tradesperson.

I've been saving up to have my kitchen redone, but I'm a bit worried about it. Last time I had any work done on the house, it took more than double the time and ended up costing me a fortune. I'm looking for a different builder this time, but how will I know I can trust them?

Many of us are desperate to make improvements to our homes after so much time spent in them during the pandemic, but it's important to choose a trader wisely. Here are some steps you should take when choosing a trader:

• Find a Trading Standards 'approved trader' - use the internet to search for one in your area or the Government's approved trader scheme TrustMark.

- **Get references or recommendations** ask people you know or ask the person you hire for examples of work they've carried out in the past. Try to avoid contractors who won't give references it's a sign they could be dishonest.
- Find out if they are a current member of a trade body trade bodies have codes of practice and can help resolve problems if things go wrong, so check your trader is a member. Ask who they're registered with and then check the trade body's website.
- Only use certified traders for gas and electrics it's dangerous to use someone who doesn't know what they're doing. Check the Gas Safe Register for a list of traders and use a registered electrician who can certify their own work. When you're having a kitchen fitted, it's worth checking whether the person you've hired will be doing the electrical or gas work themselves. If not, check who they will be using and whether they're registered.
- Get a written quote this is different to an estimate. A quote is legally binding and the builder can't change it without a good reason for example, if you ask for extra work to be done. Try to compare quotes from a number of contractors to make sure you're getting a fair price.
- **Get a written contract** this should cover exactly what you're paying for and everything you've agreed on, like timings, payments, who will pay for materials and subcontractors.
- Think carefully about payment opt to pay in stages rather than upfront. Where possible, try to pay by card as this can afford you extra safeguards if something goes wrong.
- **Keep copies of receipts** also keep your written contract as evidence, as well as photos of any problems if they arise.

Jackie's County Corner—June

I'm back and very grateful to all of you who took them time to vote by post or in person at the elections on the 6th May. I was elected to be your Councillor for the Itchen Valley Division.

Although we could not meet you earlier, we were allowed to meet you at your door after the 8th March and I had hundreds of conversations- both happy and sad.

I saw a distinct difference in those conversations in comparison to those in previous years.

- A greatly increased interest in our green environment
- A greater awareness of recycling, and how we can reduce our own Carbon footprint
- A far greater number of electric cars plugged into homes
- The health and wellbeing of you, and of those around us
- · And of course- getting out more!

Electric cars have burgeoned in the last few years. 'Range anxiety' is often less with an electric car when you plug it in at home, rather than find a fuel station. But conscious that this is not possible for residents without off street parking, WCC has provided fast and rapid charging spots at car parks in Winchester and Alresford, with more planned. HCC is trialling slow charge on-street overnight charging from lamp posts.

NewLeaf Alresford is joining a group of sites that are working with WCC and HCC trialling new forms of **verge management to increase the number of wildflowers** we see on the roadsides. The cost of maintaining a verge in this way is actually more complicated than it sounds so these trials will be really useful to see the implications. 


Join us for a six mile walk over some of Hampshire's most beautiful countryside in aid of The Not Forgotten.
