Dear Friends

I went for a ride on a motorbike the other day, up and down the valley and although I had ridden motorbikes in the past I did feel a little apprehensive about getting on a machine after 25 years!

But it was fine. Muscle memory came back as I began to learn the feel of the new machine. Some people describe that that is what it is like to pick up an instrument they haven't played for years, that somewhere in the back of the back of the amazing brain are the skills, the 'know-how' to play and make music again.

Memories are tucked away for all sorts of reasons in our minds, associated with activities or events often with poignancy. There are some memories created at moments of spiritual awareness, when we have thought carefully about faith and perhaps made a serious step of interest and exploration, maybe ending with a Confirmation that was now long ago. There are often things that bring back the 'muscle memory' of those times. In Lent we remember Jesus being led to go into the desert to pray and fast for forty days and nights. He knew that God's spirit was strongly leading him into that experience and he was obedient to it.

Often, we have sensing that moments in life are important and we want to recognise them spiritually. The arrival of a baby is one such moment, the wonder and joy at seeing this new life is one of great joy and profound for parents and often we meet in church for a baptism or thanksgiving service. That service is a beginning of a journey that parents promise to undertake with their children and with God in learning more about the Christian faith through 'private prayer and public worship'. Sadly, though that journey ends at its beginning, so often. Similarly, with services of Confirmation where there is declaration of faith and trust in Jesus Christ, some go on in Christian discipleship and others have simply marked a milestone, a rite of passage, perhaps in their school's program.

God has a memory! He remembers our first breath and cry, every moment of joy and laughter, every sadness and grief. In the bible we see that God is acquainted with all our ways and that we might pray to him in every circumstance. The amazing thing about Christian faith is knowing the presence of God and that once we have had that knowledge, we may take this further. Jesus promised, ""Look! I stand at the door and knock. If you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in, and we will share a meal together as friends." That is an amazing promise that God will be so close we can chat over a meal! But that is wonderfully how it is for those who respond to God's call in Christ.

How do you feel about the question, "What is God's spirit leading you into, reawakening in you, making you wistful for? Is it to start exploration again of faith, of asking searching questions about the Christian faith, is it to find again the first glimmerings of faith and trust in God?

In a few weeks we celebrate Easter, thinking especially about the events in Jesus' life of his deep prayers, trials, mocking's, crucifixion and death. Except it does not all end there! Jesus was wonderfully brought back to life and having conquered death lives and the benefit of his death and resurrection is for all.


Why not get in touch and we can explore this together, over a bonfire in the church yard, the garden gate, walking the dogs, or some other way, you choose!



Jackie's County Corner

Revised Minerals and Waste Plan

This is being reviewed as the previous Minerals and Waste plan was published in 2013 and the ways in which we use building materials, recycling and disposal of waste has changed considerably in a decade too. Planning the sites is essential because these sites don't always make good neighbours. One example is the proposal for the inert waste recycling plant at Three Maids Hill which was rejected by HCC last month.

County Council Accounts

The County budget went to Council in February. The Council tax rise includes 3% for adult/children social care, but not enough: it will raise £21m but costs have increased to nearly £30million

Funding for Broadband: During 20-21 HCC supported the Government Gigabit scheme with a £1m fund for this county, but because of the difficulties of the scheme and Covid, take-up was low. 



Shuttle Mediation



Mediation is a well-known way for couples to resolve issues at the end of their relationship and generally involves you both being in a room with your former partner and a mediator to discuss matters. It can be quicker and cheaper than alternative dispute resolution methods. Mediation encourages couples to compromise and helps reduce conflict which is known to be beneficial for children of separating couples.

Sometimes the barrier to mediation is that the


relationship has deteriorated to such an extent that you cannot contemplate the prospect of sitting down together in a room even with an independent mediator to address issues in mediation. Shuttle mediation gets you round

that barrier and yet has all the advantages that the mediation process offers.

It is simply a variant of the more usual mediation model.

With direct shuttle mediation, you are in separate rooms and the mediator moves between the two rooms to facilitate discussion and help you reach a compromise. Separate arrival and departure times are arranged to ensure that the risk of contact is minimised which can be reassuring for those of you with concerns. It can make the process possible but less stressful

Walking with Wildlife

It was one of those rare winter mornings: calm and clear with blue skies, dazzlingly bright sunshine, and crunchy snow underfoot. Seizing the chance to take a lockdown stroll, I head off, well wrapped up, from the back gate of our garden. Firstly, looking for tracks and signs along the snowy edge of the neighbouring field, I find a line of fresh prints showing where a roe deer had tip-toed by.

Skirting a field of dried millet-type stems, frosty-white in the morning sun, I pause to watch a gleaming flock of goldfinches busily stripping the last of the seed heads. During short winter days the search for food is relentless and these conservation crops are invaluable. A roaming party of chaffinches arrive to forage furiously. Restless, they take off, flying up and around before swarming down to resume their winter banquet. Using binoculars, I'm able to pick out a distinctive little finch among them – with a red crown; it's a redpoll.

The field boundaries of mature oaks and ash trees, a feature of the local land-scape, tower at the wayside edge. The sculptural effect of their bare branches lit up by the low sunshine is offset by the dense cladding of their ivy-covered trunks. The ivy seems to ripple with redwings, chattering fieldfares, and a solitary blackcap, all busily plucking the black ivy berries – the bird equivalent of feasting on Mars bars according to the RSPB. The thicket below also flickers with birdlife: tits, dunnocks and wrens. A robin pops up as I pass by; a blackbird breaks cover skimming away.

Tramping along the lane-side hedge I'm looking for signs of spring. Clusters of green flutes of cuckoo pint or arum, one of the earliest of spring plants, are emerging in the shelter of the hedge bottom.

Glancing across the open snowy field, I spot three brown hares, each well spaced, apparently oblivious of the red kite floating overhead. On the far side of the field, two roe deer in coats of winter-grey stand at the edge of the hazel copse.

'Take Five' and verify via a trusted method, not via numbers given in the call. Never allow anyone to remotely access your computer.

Do not download software on the request of a phone caller. A genuine service provider will never call you out of the blue regarding issues with your computer. If you are having issues with your computer, contact the retailer you purchased it from. If you are having problems with your internet connection, contact your internet provider. Genuine investment companies will not cold call you. Don't be pressured into making a quick decision and seek impartial financial advice before committing to any investment. There are no 'get rich quick' schemes. If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. When investing with genuine companies research what you have been offered and the investment company. Speak to the Financial Conduct Authority if you have concerns. Call 0800 111 6768 or visit www.fca.org.uk. They will call you to persuade you to invest in all kinds of products, including diamonds, wine or art. They offer low risk and high rates of return, claiming it's a once in a lifetime opportunity and you'll have to act quickly. If you do invest, the criminals will often request further 'transport' and 'storage' costs. These investments do not exist.

Always report scams and fraud to Action Fraud, either online at www.actionfraud.police.uk or by telephone on 0300 123 2040. Every report, Assists police investigations, provides intelligence, informs national alerts that protect all communities, disrupts criminals and reduces harm.

Contact police directly on 101 or 999 in an emergency. Forward any scam text messages to Ofcom on 7726 (free of charge). All major phone companies provide a call blocker service. This should help screen out most phone scams.

5 THINGS TO LOOK OUT FOR ON A SCAM PHONE CALL

1. The caller doesn't give you time to think, tries to stop you speaking to a family member or friend or is insistent and makes you feel uncomfortable. 2. The caller asks you to transfer money to a new account. 3. They phone to ask for your 4-digit card PIN or your online banking password. Even if they ask you to give it to them by tapping into the telephone keypad rather than saying the numbers out loud, this is a scam. 4. They ask you to withdraw money to hand over to them for safe-keeping. 5. They may say that you are a victim of fraud and offer to send a courier to your home to collect your cash, PIN, payment card or cheque book. This is just a brief guide on what to / not to do when someone calls you.

I am pleased to report a reduction in reported crime in the area of this magazine, but wish to make you aware of some in a neighbouring parish. We had an attempt to break into a car parked in Bagmore Lane, Herriard between 4:30 pm January 28th and 12:00 on the 29th. We have also had a number plate stolen from two cars parked in Winslade lay-by whilst people out walking.

I also wish to reiterate yet again the requirements for dog owners to keep their dogs on leads when near farm livestock. I am currently dealing with three dog attacks on sheep resulting in seven ewes being killed, three others have aborted their lambs and one other which was severally bitten and is undergoing treatment. In one case a dog literally ran over ¾ of a mile to get at a flock of sheep. Please be aware that farmers do have the right to shoot any dog found in the act of worrying livestock on agricultural land, it is vital that **EVERY** dog owner, and it can be any dog despite what most people say, that will chase sheep given the chance. Please keep your dog under proper control when in the countryside. Most people will not even be aware that a flock of sheep could be in the next field out of sight.

Whilst I am pleased to report a lack of reported crime within the parishes of this magazine. One large problem we are experiencing nationwide is various scams, one recently was a resident in Ellisfield having a man stating he was from the Oxfordshire Police. Usual story - had a person in custody for fraud of the residents bank card, can you confirm the details. In this case always ask for a contact number and say you will call 101 later today to be put back to them. DO NOT call anyone back at that time as they will keep their phone line open and you will end up speaking to the same group. If you can get a telephone number put it through Google as frequently it is known for operating scams.

Nearly a third of all fraud is committed over the telephone, Criminals can impersonate your bank, the police, tax office, investment or software companies and other trusted organisations. They will try to convince you to part with your money. Hang up on cold calls from any business/authority, then 'Take Five' to check it out as genuine via a trusted source. The three most common scams are: 1. Your computer has a problem - 2. A fraud investigation - 3. An investment opportunity.

<u>Fraudster's tactics</u> - Criminals can disguise their phone number to make it look like it's from a bank, the tax office, the police... or anyone. They can call you with what looks like a genuine phone number. They will keep your landline open by not hanging up and even play a dialling tone over the phone. They can text messages requesting you call them, or click on a link. These messages usually appear in the same text thread as genuine messages and send website links which can steal your data and money when you click on them. Never trust the caller ID display and record the number where possible.

A computer problem - Criminals may call and claim that there are problems with your computer or internet. They claim to be your computer manufacturer, telephone or internet service provider and suggest they can help you. They instruct you to download a program which gives the criminal remote access to your computer. They can then access your bank. If you receive a call like this hang up. 'Take Five' and verify via a trusted method, not via numbers given in the call. Never allow anyone to remotely access your

On the Farm—Ben Robinson

At the time of writing I have spent the last week thawing pipes. Night time frost is not a problem for livestock but when the temperature falls below freezing day and night for more than a day or two things can become quite challenging. The surface of the water troughs freezing is easy to deal with, but the freezing of water pipes is more problematic.

If we could be sure of very cold weather every winter it would be cost effective to dig water pipes into the ground, rather than have them laid on the surface or suspended between buildings. However, as we only get a proper freeze every few years the pipes remain exposed and I make do with bowsers, blow torches, boiling water and muck when it freezes. As any gardener will be aware muck makes its own heat as it breaks down. Before a cold spell is forecast it is good practice to heap generous amounts of muck around the water trough pipe work. Heat can then be generated and the water prevented from freezing.

The Brexit deadline has been and gone. Much to the surprise of industry commentators the lamb price hasn't crashed, but has instead rallied to dizzying new heights. Sadly I sold most of my lambs before Christmas, with only the last 80 to go next week- always the way!

Lambing will start around the 20th March. Due to Covid induced cabin fever I have had an abundance of youngsters contact me wanting to help with lambing. Hopefully they will enjoy the experience. The scan this year is 192% so I am expecting in the region of 725 lambs to be born. Plenty of work for all.



Last month in **Oxdrove** I was setting out my case for the re-opening of our society and economy that moves in lockstep with the incredible success of our covid-19 vaccination programme. I hold 100% to that view and predict the public, let alone Parliament, will grow increasingly furious if one doesn't follow the other.

That is why I continue to push the case for **schools** to fully re-open on 8th March given the untold damage being done to the forgotten victims of this pandemic – our young people.

As I said to the Prime Minister in the House of Commons last month, I am genuinely shocked by the sense of desperation and concern parents in the constituency are communicating to me given what they are seeing from their children. We have a vaccine which is being rolled out at pace, and while it will face challenges as new strains emerge, we have to accept a balance of risks as we always have. I have called for teachers and school (as well as early years) staff to be vaccinated as soon as possible because, as I see it, if schools really are our national priority we need to start acting like it.

And finally, continuing my determination to remind constituents that Parliament is doing other things at this time alongside managing the crisis, you may be interested in some of the other strands of my work at this time. Through my ongoing work as the Chair of the all-party group for childcare and early education, I am stepping up efforts to make the case for the **early years sector** too often over-looked while a genuine lifeline for many working parents. Equally, I am picking up again my work on local transport services as commuters prepare (someday) to return to the railways. The issue of 'part-time' **season tickets** hasn't gone away – in fact it just got even more important – so watch this space from Government / SWR this spring. And I am about to embark on some work around the vexed issue of **shared parental leave** for new mum's and dad's which was fudged by the coalition Government and – for all the grandstanding – hasn't gone away.
