

It was going to be a brilliant shot.

The heron was perched on the far side of a pool. The weather was perfect, the water was still. I had the camera on autofocus with the focusing square locked onto the bird. The exposure was right; all was well. I was in a hide on the other side of the road about 60 yards from the animal and all I had to do was wait. And wait and wait and wait. Just as the bird moved a couple of times and started to open its wings, a lorry drove past.

When the lorry cleared the field of view the bird had gone and I was left muttering words wouldn't have used if the bishop was sitting next to me.



One thing I've learned from wildlife and sport photography is that you are going to have missed opportunities. You look the wrong way, you focus on the wrong thing, you don't press the shutter in time, all lead to lost images that would have been competition entries. Most people can identify with this. A failed job interview, a missed appointment, a botched relationship can so easily end up with a sense of "what if."

The things that professional photographers say is don't worry about the missed opportunities, rather get ready for the next one. If we focus on the regret of not achieving what we want, we miss out on the next thing that comes along. There will always be another opportunity, but we don't grasp it by looking back. But while there will be more opportunities the number and quality of opportunities are affected by what we do.

There is a well know military phrase about following the 5 p's I won't tell you what specifically these are. If you want to know, ask an old soldier. But loosely translated they say that proper preparation prevents a below standard performance. The thing I've learned as a husband, father, grandfather, priest and photographer is that the more investment I put into a situation the greater the outcome.

But what about when the outcome isn't so good? There are a few instances in my career where I deeply regret a choice I've made. I was offered two posts as a second curacy. I choose one in good faith but with hindsight should have taken the other one. When I'm in a dark mood and think about the "what if" moments I come back to the rocks in my life of faith and family and continue to be grateful for what I have.

RSV Vaccination

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is an enveloped RNA virus, in the same family as the human parainfluenza viruses and mumps and measles viruses. RSV is one of the common viruses that cause coughs and colds in winter. RSV is transmitted by large droplets and by secretions from contact with an infected person.

Infants under one year of age and the elderly are at the greatest risk of developing severe disease. While most RSV infections usually cause mild illness, infants aged less than 6 months frequently develop the most severe disease such as bronchiolitis and pneumonia, which may result in hospitalisation.

From 1 September 2024, 2 new respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) vaccination programmes will be introduced:

Programme for older adults aged 75 to 79 years old

All adults turning 75 years old on or after 1 September 2024 will be eligible for the routine programme and should be offered a single dose of the RSV vaccine. A oneoff catch-up campaign for those already aged 75 to 79 years old on 1 September

Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

On a breezy morning of bright sunshine, we head along to Micheldever Woods for a late summer ramble. As we stroll up the main avenue, the beechwoods begin to throb with the calls of woodpigeons, offset by the long whistles of nuthatches and the sudden goblin shrieks of jays. A solitary robin sings a wistful tune from deep in the leaf canopy. Of butterflies, only a speckled wood busies itself, fluttering around a tangle of bramble. A silver Y moth though dives down to hide among the foliage, blending perfectly, apart from the gleam of its gamma symbols.

We pause to sit on a conveniently placed log bench, to listen to the squeaks of a coal tit and the explosive trill of a wren. Looking up to scan the skyline of a stand of mature conifers, we note this year's bumper crop of spruce cones, sunlit and ripening to a pale brown. A flicker of movement reveals two small birds, darting out from their treetop perches to loop and swoop, snapping at insects – these are spotted flycatchers.

Greyish-brown above and faintly striped on head and pale chest – it's the younger birds that tend to be spotty – these flycatchers are summer visitors. Perching upright, and all of a twitch, these active little birds favour parks, gardens and woodland edges. They nest here, often tucked away in the climbers growing on a high wall. By September these intrepid little birds will be heading south on their long migration, spending the winter largely in West Africa. Surveys of ringed birds have shown that some venture as far south as Namibia, before returning here in the spring.

From the sunlit treetops, our attention turns to the puddles and pools along the shady woodland rides, where the muddy edges are full of the prints of dogs and deer. One pool, well-watered in our damp summer, is still wiggling with tadpoles. These are 'Peter Pan' tadpoles. Apparently, the water temperature is too cool for them to develop into froglets – so they will overwinter at the tadpole stage.



Summary There was a warm start to August and a thunderstorm with heavy downpours on the 1st brought almost an inch and a half of rain. This was the exception for a month with sunny spells and the occasional light rain or drizzle during the day, and some overnight rain.

Temperatures generally fluctuated around the seasonal norm before a warm spell in the second week, with the warmest day at 85°F on the 12th. Temperatures were then mostly below normal for the remainder of the month. Overall, the temperature for August was average whilst rainfall was above that expected for the time of year. The

On the Farm—Julian Gibbons

Farming is perhaps a different industry from many in the modern world. It is very 'rooted'. Unlike many businesses I can't register my farm as a company abroad, operating online from Dublin or the Cayman Islands. Farming is always on show for all to see, for good or ill. The mistakes are often obvious, and usually noticed by the neighbours!

Farmers tend not to move very far by necessity. The Welsh talk of 'hiraeth', or connection to their place or valley. In Scottish Gaelic there is a word 'dùthchas' which roughly translates as the bond between the people and the land around them. Do we have this in the modern English countryside, where the talk is as often about house prices, share prices and Artificial Intelligence as crops, cattle and the Autumn foraging season? Some people do still feel a connection I think, and I imagine it grows on new residents of our area the longer they live here.

I know when I was a student in Glasgow one of the things I missed most was brick and flint walls- something I had never particularly noticed before. Though some of us have lived here for virtually our whole lives, there is always a churn of population, those moving in and those moving away. Those born and those sadly no longer with us. It is good to remember that change is a constant, and something we all have to deal with, whether we lean into it, or back away from it.

The same is true of farming businesses. Over the past five years there has been a substantial re-structuring of farming in the Candover Valley with land being put out to contract rather than farmed in hand. This has been mirrored across the largely arable areas of England with a continuing trend of fewer, bigger farms aided by ever larger and technically advanced machinery. Some sectors still employ significant numbers of people, dairy, horticulture, pigs and vines for example. However broad scale combinable cropping employs ever fewer. In some ways this does not mattergreater labour efficiency has been the way of agriculture since man first put a hoe in the ground in Mesopotamia around 10,000 years ago.

However, I think there does come a point when the critical mass of farming labour required to manage the landscape is lost. The local farmer is needed with the JCB to move the fallen trees out of the way after the winter storm. The man with a tractor who clears the snow or pulls cars at a local wedding out of the muddy car park. The volunteers required to run the Alresford Show and other rural events. The tractor to pull the carol singers round the parish at Christmas time. Even a willing farmer or two to write the Oxdrove Farming Column! For all this to continue to happen enough people need to be employed in the rural community and for our area to be a true place of work, not simply a nice place to live.

The 2024 Basingstoke and District Ploughing Match is being held at Folly Farm, North Waltham, RG25 2BS on 5th October. 8.30am – Midday. Please go along and watch the competition. Entry is free.
