#### Message from Ian

In April the churches of the Benefice will be celebrating Easter. I like Easter, it is a festival that always happens at a nice time of the year. The days are noticeable longer and a bit warmer.

Easter is a time to celebrate new life, lambs and calves will be in the fields, The woods are alive with bird song and the family of squirrels that I am still trying to photograph have had a brood of kits. So, we celebrate this by giving chocolate easter eggs which leave us with a mild chocolate repulsion but are still infinitely better than giving a painted boiled egg.



For Christians there is a sombre aspect of Easter that makes it harder for our non Christian friends to buy into. We talk a lot about how an innocent man was betrayed, arrested, went through a mock trial, beaten and then hung out to die in a brutal way.

We hold onto these things not because we are attracted to the 18 rated horror of a brutal murder but because we believe that one unique man, by surrendering his life has made such a huge difference to the lives of billions of people around the world. That is why the cross, which was built as a torture instrument, is held in such high honour by all Christians.

Easter isn't simply about remembering a horror show because the second part of the Easter message is the resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday.

If you are not a Christian, the resurrection is a difficult thing to swallow. Dying on a cross in Roman times was easy, hundreds of thousands of people suffered that fate but rising from the dead is a different story.

There are plenty of reasons for Christians to believe that Jesus rose from the dead and we will talk a lot this in the Easter services. For me, the compelling reason for the this is the way that the resurrection affects people's lives.

So, can I ask you to reflect as you scoff your second Easter egg of the day that the promise of a new start isn't just the world around us but can apply to you as well.





#### Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

Wisps of winter gnats, cousins of the dangle-legged crane flies, dance in the late afternoon sunshine at the bottom of our garden. Bobbing and bouncing low over the damp lawn and heaps of leaf mulch, they catch the light as the males try to impress the females with their shimmering displays.

Although winter gnats are remarkably hardy, they're not the only insects out and about early in the year. On mild sunny days, queen bumblebees, especially the buff-tailed variety, hungry for pollen and nectar, are cruising around. They search for early spring flowers and suitable nest sites such as an old mouse burrow. The deep buzz of one of these large furry bees caught my attention while walking across to Northington Grange. In bright sunshine I watched her rather clumsy flight, lurching low over the grassy verges as though still groggy from a long winter sleep. By chance a brimstone butterfly, sulphur yellow, flashed into view – the first of the season - followed by two more chasing away on their springtime adventures.

We've been helping with the farmland bird surveys that are being held here in the Candover Valley. At Newhouse Farm, we were pleased to record woodlarks singing. With milder winters in recent years, they've been returning to the wooded chalk downlands, spreading from their traditional haunts in the forest heaths. Woodlarks have a wonderful song, reflected in their scientific name *Lullula arborea*, delivered from a song post at the woodland edge. Alas, being ground-nesting birds, they are often vulnerable to accidental trampling.

In hazy sunshine, a large raptor, neither buzzard nor red kite, was gliding along the treeline of Micheldever Wood, where the open fields of the downs meet the sweeping boundary of the beechwoods. The pale underparts, sshaped curve to the wing edge, plus the long tail, revealed a female goshawk – that elusive nemesis of woodpigeons and squirrels. Goshawks are still quite scarce and rarely seen, though sometimes glimpsed swooping through fairly dense woodland. Mating pairs are said to perform an extraordinary springtime display known as sky-dancing.





#### Oh Deer!

Deer are frequently seen in the Candover Valley - of the six different species living in United Kingdom, three (fallow, roe and muntjac) are well established here. The abundance of food, maize in particular and shelter (woodland) has seen the population explode over the last 30 plus years.

The result is considerable damage to agricultural crops and woodland but also an increase in road traffic collisions.

#### **REDUCE YOUR RISK – DRIVE DEER AWARE**

#### Beware during peak danger periods

Highest-risk times are from sunset to midnight, and the hours shortly before and after sunrise.

#### Drive with caution

During peak danger periods or on roads where hitting a deer is a possibility, drive with caution and be on the lookout for deer near the road.

#### Seen one? Look for another

Be aware that more deer may well cross after the one you have noticed.

#### Use your lights

After dark, do use full-beam when there is no opposing traffic. BUT, when a deer or other animal is noted on the road, dim your headlights as animals startled by the beam may 'freeze' rather than leaving the road.

#### DON'T VEER FOR DEER

#### Don't over-swerve to avoid hitting a deer

If a collision with the animal seems inevitable, then hit it while maintaining full control of your car is the safest option.

The alternative of swerving into oncoming traffic or off of the road surface could be a lot worse. Motorcyclists are at particular risk when in direct collisions with animals.

#### Look out for traffic behind you

Only brake sharply and stop if there is no danger of being hit by following traffic, and use your hazard lights.

#### STAY SAFE AND REPORT THE INCIDENT

- If you see an injured deer on the roadside?
- Pull over at a safe place
- Call the Police.

Giving as precise a location as you can. Use What3Words if you can. They will deal with the situation and have access to specialists.

**Do not** try to assist or move the deer as this can put you in danger.

#### If you hit a deer while driving, your priorities, in this order, are:

- Keep yourself and anyone with you as safe as you can
- Park your car in the safest place with hazard lights on.
- Call an ambulance if human injuries warrant it
- Call the Police



#### On the Farm— Ben Robinson

At the time of writing, we are 5 days into lambing. It has been a slow start to the campaign with around 20 ewes lambing a day. Some years we can have around 50 lambing a day at peak. The cold North Easterly wind is whipping through, and the nights have been frosty, but the lambs are being born at very healthy sizes and the ewes have a lot of milk about them. At least it has been dry so far, a key ingredient to a good lambing. Quite an improvement on last year!

Farming is in a funny place at the moment; alongside the APR/IHT debacle the Sustainable Farming Incentive scheme has just been closed to new applicants with no warning, leaving a big hole in many farm finances. This was a scheme that paid farmers for environmental works such as hedgerow planting, creating and managing herbal leys and drilling wildlife friendly cover crops. Those currently in the scheme such as us are still under contract and will continue to be paid at the time of writing. However no new applicants will be accepted. Our scheme finishes in 2026 and if there is no attractive replacement we will have to go back to farming up to the hedge line for maximum output to replace the lost income. The government needs the money for defence, health, welfare and all the other demands on the public purse. The bees, birds and butterflies will be paying the bill.

Grain prices are very poor due to a worldwide cereal glut at the moment but by contrast the beef price has gone up faster than a Space X rocket. Cattle are fetching £400-500 more than the equivalent beasts last year. It appears to be a perfect storm of rising demand for beef and a decline in cattle numbers over the past decade. High cattle prices is a worldwide phenomenon with US beef also fetching record prices. Sheep and lamb prices remain healthy and unusually have stayed at similar levels from September to now. Usually there is a seasonal price curve, with values lowering through the Autumn and rising in the spring before peaking in May and June.

Hopefully some of you will have made it to our 'Lambing Day' that happened on 29<sup>th</sup> March. Following the slightly overwhelming success of last year, when visitor numbers got a bit out of hand and traffic around the farm ground to a halt we have used an online system of pre-booking for vehicles. We are quite constrained by parking due to farm layout, so we thought it was the safest way of running the event this year. It is wonderful to be able to share the farm with the public, many of whom are actually pretty knowledgeable about sheep farming due to a heavy diet of Clarkson's Farm, Countryfile and Lambing Live.

#### Patient Survey Results

Between 2020 and 2024 our patients told us they were not happy with our telephone system. Put simply, it didn't work as anyone hoped and patients and surgery staff alike were frustrated with its limitations. 

#### Summary

There was a cold start to February with temperatures mostly well below the seasonal norm. In fact, it was not until the end of the third week that temperatures recovered as cold easterly winds in the middle of the week gave way to milder weather and frontal systems brought rain and the wettest day with 0.84 inches on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. The mildest night occurred on the 21<sup>st</sup> with a temperature of 49°F and this exceeded the long-term average daytime temperature for February. High pressure at the end of the month brought fine, sunny weather and the coldest night at 24°F on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Not surprisingly, the month was colder than normal, and somewhat wetter. The winter season was also colder than normal but with average rainfall.

Jackie's County Corner

**The process for the Hampshire wide Strategic Mayoralty** has started now the Government has accepted Hampshire's bid to make the change. Strategic Mayor elections will be on the 7<sup>th</sup> May 2026.

**Local Government Reorganisation is a separate work programme. LGR will result in several Unitary authorities** of around 500,000 people in each. Elections will be in 2027 or 2028.

When you read this, Southampton, Hampshire, the Isle of Wight and Portsmouth, together with Winchester and all the other districts will have made their first proposals for Unitary Authorities to the Government on the 21<sup>st</sup> March. You can read Hampshire's submission on www.hants.gov.uk

The revenue budget deficit at HCC has been reduced using reserves but remains at around £100m per year. So, another consultation this month, but proposals made only reduce the deficit by £9.9m over four topics. These proposals to reduce costs in four areas including Adult Day Care services, Planned Highway Maintenance, and Children's and Young People's school & college transport **Deadline 7 May** There has been a lot of debate about the terrible potholes in this area, and how HCC chooses to spend our Council Tax. One of the four proposals is to reduce the planned highway maintenance. HCC propose not to include any money from the HCC funds but limit the budget to the sum provided for this purpose by Government. I'm sure that many of you will want to comment on this proposal!

**Changes in HCC transport costs to school and college** are proposed too. The 1946 law is clear that children with special needs or on free school meals are fully entitled to free transport up to 16, but the County Council believes that post 16 to 25, this is not the case.

The proposal put forward by HCC is to provide these grants only if a young person is entitled to free school meals *and* an EHCP. It takes no account of the logistics of getting multiple children to school at one time. HCC is proposing to extend the scheme whereby they provide expenses for parents taking their own child to school or they will recover some of the transport costs. These options will be extended to more families. The initial proposal was also to charge parents 30% of the cost of transport which could be £3000 or even higher. Many residents have written to me about this saying how it will affect their own family. Councillors (including me) have challenged this, but it has been decided that the consultation will go ahead. Please advertise to others if you have the opportunity.

## The public consultation on this and other proposed cuts runs from 12<sup>th</sup> March to the 7 May.

I spent a very happy afternoon playing with grandchildren at our local HCC owned country park. I really hope these aren't victims of budget deficits- they are such jewels in the crown.

**A Bus Service Improvement Programme grant of just over £13million** was confirmed on the 6<sup>th</sup> March. BSIP is an ongoing grant programme, aiming for a full return to bus travel to pre-Covid 19 levels, but it doesn't tackle the funding that is needed to improve rural services, nor the travel options for the 18.9% of our residents who don't have access or ability to drive their own vehicle. As our population ages, this should be a priority. I will continue to make this case along with councillors from all parties. Will this all improve with promised Mayoral control of transport? I hope so.
