

On the Farm— Ben Robinson

I do try to stay away from politics in my Oxdrove articles. However, the recent budget has felt intensely personal for many farmers and growers. The government repeatedly told the farmers that there would be no change to the rules surrounding Agricultural and Business Property Relief. In the Budget they then performed a total U- turn, imposing Inheritance Tax on family businesses with no consultation or impact assessment.

The new Inheritance Tax rules will protect those with a nice house and a hobby smallholding, they will also not affect most of the very largest landowners who often hold their land in Trusts or in complex offshore tax structures, outside the scope of IHT. The large landholdings of NGOs such as the National Trust, Wildlife Trusts and other charities are also unaffected. Corporations also escape the new rules.

What it will do is present an unpayable tax bill to working family farmers operating as Partnerships or Sole Traders. A 500 acre well equipped farm with a dairy herd and decent machinery will be looking at a bill of $\pm 1-2$ million with each generation that passes. This is not money that is liquid and available, as it is with Capital Gains Tax or Income Tax, both of course already paid by farmers. The only way to raise funds will be to sell business assets, making the enterprise unviable. It will become pointless to invest in UK agriculture. If Labour's aim was to target the idle rich going after people who get up at 3.30am to milk cows seems a pretty bizarre way of going about it.

The whole industry is worried. Owner occupiers of course, but also tenants whose landlords may have evict them to sell the farm to pay the IHT bill. The land is very unlikely to be bought for farming in the current climate. Re-wilding, solar, housing or warehouses are the way the wind is blowing. The allied industries such as machinery dealers, vets, feed merchants and farm suppliers are deeply concerned for their customer base. Many tenant farmers will be above the IHT threshold just with the value of their livestock and machinery.

Even the DEFRA Secretary of State Steve Reed is now suggesting farmers to do 'proper business tax planning'. It's fair to say when a government brings in a tax and then starts offering advice on how to get round their own policy, it probably wasn't the right course of action. The Chancellor has at the time of writing refused to meet with the NFU President.

Some farming families will not be able to plan. In theory the 7-year rule allows a gift of a farm to be made from an older to a younger generation, without IHT being applicable. However, if the gift is made the older generation cannot receive any income from the farm business, or live in farm housing. Many simply cannot do this as their pension was the farm business. A farm still subject to a mortgage can be gifted, but this immediately triggers a Stamp Duty liability across the value of the whole farm, and at a similar rate to what the IHT would be. Trusts can be an option, but as land in Trust is not owned by the farmer, you cannot borrow against the value of the land. This means for most there will no way of investing in machinery, buildings or livestock. Heads they win, Tails you lose.

This Boxing Day the Hampshire Hunt will be meeting in central Alresford. All are welcome to come and see the horses and hounds. 10.45am on Station Road.

We have vaccinated 2,495 patients (to date) & this is all in addition to our usual workload.

RSV Vaccination

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is an enveloped RNA virus, in the same family as the human parainfluenza viruses and mumps and measles viruses. RSV is one of the common viruses that cause coughs and colds in winter. RSV is transmitted by large droplets and by secretions from contact with an infected person.

Infants under one year of age and the elderly are at the greatest risk of developing severe disease. While most RSV infections usually cause mild illness, infants aged less than 6 months frequently develop the most severe disease such as bronchiolitis and pneumonia, which may result in hospitalisation.

From 1 September 2024, 2 new respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) vaccination programmes will be introduced:

Programme for older adults aged 75 to 79 years old

All adults turning 75 years old on or after 1 September 2024 will be eligible for the routine programme and should be offered a single dose of the RSV vaccine. A one-off catch-up campaign for those already aged 75 to 79 years old on 1 September 2024 will be undertaken at the earliest opportunity.

Programme for pregnant women to protect infants

All women who are at least 28 weeks pregnant (the eligible cohort) on 1 September 2024, will be offered a single dose of the RSV vaccine. After that, pregnant women will become eligible as they reach 28 weeks gestation and remain eligible up to birth. We will be offering this vaccination at the Surgery, however if you are eligible, you will be contacted in due course as we plan to be running clinics in the New Year.

Medication supplies over the Christmas break

If you take regular medications, please make sure you have enough to see you over the festive period and please place requests with us in good time if repeats will be needed.

If you have family coming to stay with you remind them not to forget their medicines.

<u>eConsult will be switched off during the Christmas & New Year bank hol-iday period:</u>

Any eConsult request you submit outside of our normal surgery opening hours will not be read until we open the next working day. Patients will not be able to submit eConsults over the weekend or bank holiday period.

All the other eConsult advice services will still be accessible 24/7.

The Water Rail's Tale

Even in the quietest parts of winter, our local chalk streams hum with activity. As coots and moorhens glide across the surface, one of their relatives may be hiding in plain sight. At around 23-28cm long, the water rail is smaller than these more outgoing members of the Rallidae family, but just as fond of damp places. Ponds, marshes, reedbeds, wetlands, and rivers are all potential homes for this enigmatic bird.

One reason for the water rail's wide variety of habitats is its omnivorous diet. Although it mostly eats fish, snails, and insects, it will also snack on roots, seeds, and berries. There are even reports of water rails catching small amphibians, mammals, and birds. With its long legs, long toes, and long beak, this species is perfectly adapted for hunting and foraging on boggy ground or in shallow water.

The water rail sports distinctive colouration that makes it fairly easy to identify. Its face and underside are grey, while its back is dappled brown and black. Zebra-like stripes along its flanks lead into bright white feathers under its tail, and both its eyes and beak are a striking red. As a chick, the water rail's black feathers make it resemble a baby coot or moorhen – the trick is to look for a pale yellow beak instead of a red one.

Despite having snazzy plumage and being relatively widespread, the water rail is notoriously elusive. Its camouflage helps it to blend into the

undergrowth, and its skittishness causes it to run for cover when startled. The odds of a sighting do increase during winter, when the UK population is boosted by visitors from the colder parts of Europe. True to their cautious nature, these migrating birds usually travel at night.

While you need sharp eyes and good luck to see a water rail, you may have a better chance of hearing one. Of their greatest hits - which include creaks, whistles, groans, and even purrs - their most common call in wintertime is known as "sharming". Used to converse, mark territory, or express alarm, this call is a mixture of grunting and squealing that would make a piglet proud!

Since the water rail is so shy, it likes riverbanks that have lots of lush plant life. To welcome these beautiful birds, we need to allow a thick fringe of vegetation to flourish along the water's edge. To learn more about how chalk streams can be improved for wildlife, check out the Watercress and



Summary October saw a mix of settled spells due to high-pressure and wet weather from a succession of low-pressure systems. An Atlantic low arrived on the 6th and brought a few days of wet weather including moderate to heavy showers and almost an inch of rain on the 8th. Then there were then a few days of dry and settled conditions before slow-moving weather fronts brought more rain. Continuous rain and a moderate to fresh breeze heralded the arrival of the first name storm of the season, Storm Ashley, on the 20th. The last week and a half was generally dull with occasional rain. Overall, the rainfall and temperature for October were slightly below the seasonal norm.





Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

The mild misty days of early November seemed to be trapped under a blanket of low cloud. Despite skies of a dull mushroom grey, the downland beeches stood out with splendid displays of autumn leaf colours. The canopies of field oaks along the valley were also quite impressive; so too the hedgebanks and coppices of hazel.

Taking an afternoon stroll in this twilight world down at the Swarraton water meadows, shades of grey were an enduring theme. There were the muted tones of a grey heron taking off, plus three grey-brown cygnets of mute swans, now quite independent, tucking into the water plants in the surging brook.

A horse chestnut tree, bare of leaves, stood alone, its upper branches host to four dark raptors, well-spaced, each with forked tails – red kites. As we watched a fifth kite floated in, swooping round to perch with the others – but not for long, as they all took off, gliding away silently over the trees. Walking back by St. John's, we paused amused by the antics of jackdaws, playing high on the church tower, each trying to be the one to perch on the crest of the golden weathervane.

Later in the week after a busy day indoors, we were keen to go for a brisk walk and headed out around the edge of the back fields. With the end of British Summer Time, late afternoon walks are now taken in the half-light of early dusk – a time of silhouettes and shadows.

We were quickly alerted to a flock of birds clustering in the far treetops, lifting off and landing, clearly restless and not quite ready to settle down to roost. Their chattering calls were reassuringly familiar – the clamour of wintering thrushes – the nomadic redwings. Newly arrived from Finland and Scandinavia, their appearance around Hallowe'en or Bonfire Night signals the seasonal change in the bird world.

Glancing upwards and along the treeline, we also spotted a pair of very energetic bats, pipistrelles, whizzing back and forth, busily snapping up insects in the mild air.



Jackie's County Corner

Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! I know it's a busy time, and replying to consultations is the last thing on your mind on December but please do at least this first one!

Everyone has a view about the NHS Now is the time to give that view. To respond to the NHS 10-year plan consultation, go to https://change.nhs.uk/en-GB/ or simply type in

change.nhs.uk into google or www.gov.uk. Deadline 22nd December.

What are the barriers to Cycling and Walking for you? This is a new survey on behalf of HCC and WCC to aid work on the Council's Movement Strategy. Deadline 22nd December. Go to www.hants.gov.uk/barriers-walking-cycling

A route has been agreed for the next (southerly) section of the Worthy Down cycle path from the Harestock water treatment works to Wellhouse Lane, due to be completed Spring 2025. I have asked for some maintenance on the whole route, following heavy rainfall.

School Transport

In late October, the County Council were proposing changes to the education transport but withdrew plans at the last minute. School transport costs the Council over £85million a year, and the cost is rising, so this is one area where HCC wants to reduce the revenue budget.

I have written more detail on my website, but National Policies continue to be discriminatory against children in rural areas attending their local rural school, which may be a bus ride away from their own village. Parents also tell me they believe the 'walk to school' ethos is impossible to achieve for working parents. What do you think? Getting it right is important for the whole community: because school traffic is a huge proportion of the morning and afternoon congestion we face. Please look out for the consultation, and I will remind you in a future 'County Corner'. To be useful, I have asked HCC to seek responses from parents of children 'yet to travel', as well as those already travelling.

The proposed budgets cuts to 'Lollipop staff', Buses & Alresford HWRC were not agreed.

Kings Worthy has a school crossing patrol, which was one of the services threatened in the cuts. It was agreed that these wouldn't be removed as proposed. I am asking schools to include Parish and Town Councils when they update their school travel plans to support all additional safety measures near to the school.

The 75, 6, 64 and 67 buses will continue, and the 240 and 95 seem safe for now. The KB1 minibus is now running 6 days a week, funded for two years to October 2027. The Alresford HWRC is saved! Volume collected is at 24th out of 24 sites, so please use it often!


