My car is due an MOT this month and I'm dreading it. It's reached the age where things feel OK but when the expert looks at it things go wrong. You end up with a complete litany of things that need fixing and face the choice of scrapping it and buying a new car or sticking with what you've got for another year. However much we dread the cost of the MOT it is still something worth having. The thought of coming down Farleigh Wallop hill to find there is an issue with the brakes is not a thought I want to linger on.



The season of Lent is going to start in March but needs some preparation time. Lent, along with Advent, is a time when those of us who are Christians are supposed to put their faith through a bit of an MOT. When I was a Vicar in North London the Diocese did this very seriously. The Clergy had to ask five people to fill in an appraisal. We were then summoned to meet with what felt like an inquisitor who would go through the reports. We all vaguely dreaded this because we were expected not to ask people who were friends but some, at least, who found our ministry challenging. The inquisitor always turned out to be wise and kind who fed back 5 good things we were going and a couple of things that needed sorting out. One of mine, was always scruffy shoes and untidy hair no idea what happened to that!

So here are two questions for you to think about in the run up to Lent. Firstly, how much have you been praying and reading your Bible recently. If the answer is "not much" the Church of England has a really good app called daily prayer that, if you don't live in the dead zone around Preston Candover is worth accessing.

Secondly, how frequently are you are attending Church? When your Church doesn't have a service could you go along to one of the other Churches in the Benefice in Lent.

Finally, and this applies regardless of the faith we possess, how are we responding to the human need that exists in Basingstoke and Winchester. How much have we given to the foodbanks that provide urgent support to people who ae homeless or on benefits?

Taking stock is something you can do on your own, but it is more effective if we find someone who is kind and wise to help us set targets and make a success of this special time of year


Candover Valley Gardening Club

Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

In the chill air of a frosty dawn, I glimpsed a large pale bird gliding low along the grassy edge of the back field, before vanishing into the glow of the rising sun. It was a barn owl, an elusive local resident, probably hunting for voles.

On sunset strolls here at Northington Down, we look and listen, alert for chance encounters with winter wildlife. On one walk just before Christmas we met the owl again. It floated out from the dark wooded wall of a hazel coppice. We watched as it swooped and swerved, fluttering like a huge white moth, as head down it scanned the grassland below, before slipping away to hunt elsewhere.

Herds of fallow deer roam the fields and copses leading up to Micheldever Wood. Often, we meet a dozen or so, who stand and stare before racing away. Early in the New Year though, there was a great gathering of fallow deer, a herd of some sixty or more, escorted by four or five bucks with their distinctive antlers. They were all dressed in their winter coats of grey or brown – apart from three of the does who were bright white.

The local roe deer tend to stay in smaller family groups, while the muntjacs follow their own solitary trails – rather like the fox who we spotted crossing a field.

By contrast, a majestic grey heron flying over the Woolpack Inn at Totford, set the scene as we headed off for a wintry morning ramble along the Wayfarer's Walk. Vast flocks of wintering woodpigeons crowded the distant treetops on the far side of the Candover Valley, along with a huge throng of rooks. Both red kites and buzzards floated around the trees in the valley bottom, where the brook ran swift and clear. We were delighted to find some early snowdrops in flower beside the path.

Other highlights of our walk included being surprised by a gingery brown stoat, bounding swiftly along a hedge bottom with something small and furry in its mouth.

On the Farm— Ben Robinson

It is always a joy when we pass the shortest day, and the days begin to lengthen slightly. The countdown to lambing begins and the work rate picks up a bit incrementally as we march towards our start date of the 10th March. Our scanning this year has not been that exciting at 161%. ie. 1.61 lambs to be born per ewe. A good scan for a mule flock would be 180-190%. Scans of 200%+ have been achieved, though these very high rates actually become less profitable due to the number of orphans which have to be raised on milk powder.

This is the second year we have scanned in the low 160% range which is disappointing. The ewes appeared to be in good condition, and we have certainly given them everything we could have done nutritionally. This was backed up by blood testing from the vets. There could be an element of bluetongue or Schmallenburg that affected the scanning rates, or it could simply be the replacement ewes that I sourced have not been from particularly prolific blood lines. It gives us food for thought on the breed we use. Perhaps something like the Romney may suit our system better? The Romney originates from Romney marsh in Kent/East Sussex and is the most numerous breed in the Southern hemisphere. The breed performs remarkably well-off forage, crucially needing far less input than the mules. Food for thought.

We have been approached by the National Sheep Association as one of the farms to enter a project looking at the integration of sheep into arable systems. This will investigate the effect on the sheep, arable crops, cover crops and soil of the symbiosis between sheep and arable. It appears to be an interesting study and hopefully will lead to some evidence about the slightly vague belief that many of us hold in the 'Golden hoof', shorthand for the benefits of sheep for arable land.

One thing I would like to be looked at is frost tolerance for grazed cover crops. Following a few days of hard frost recently the cover crops appear to be disappearing before my eyes!

Bluetongue rumbles on, and frustratingly the government don't appear to be willing to do away with the control zones even though we are told the midges do not circulate the disease below 12c. It has led to me selling lambs to the East of here, as the outlets to the West are unable to take livestock from Hampshire due to our county being in the bluetongue control zone.

The largest market in the Southeast corner of England is Ashford, which is very large and a modern, efficient set up. However, I have also taken some lambs to Hailsham in East Sussex which was a fabulous experience. Hailsham market is in the open air, bang slap in the town centre, a long slow journey from here along small roads and all a bit ramshackle. However, the prices were good, the auction staff friendly, and above all it was a lot of fun. And if we can't have a bit of fun in our working life, we may as well do something else!



Summary

There was a mild start to December, with the warmest day and night time temperatures recorded on the 1st. It briefly became much colder as temperatures dropped sharply with the coldest night at 26°F on the 4th. Storm Darragh brought thick cloud and continuous rain with a fresh to strong breeze on the 7th, then further dull weather with light rain or drizzle in the second week. A cold northerly breeze kept daytime temperatures below the seasonal norm with the coldest day at 41°F on the 13th. The unsettled weather continued into the following week, but it was milder with a little more sun. There was low cloud with fog or mist on six consecutive days from the 24th, some slow to clear, and no sun in the last eight days of the month. Overall, December was mild and dry, with approximately half the normal rainfall total.





Jackie's County Corner

After a gloomy winter, this old saying may lift your mood! "No winter lasts forever and no Spring skips its turn".

Many of you know that we open our garden under the NGS scheme for the spring bulbs. Wet weather can make it difficult to accommodate everyone, so we're limiting visitors, asking you to book in advance. You can see more about the NGS and book for The Down House on www.ngs.org.uk. This year, our booking days are midweek, so you can catch the bus if you wish!

Climate resilience will be an increasing part of Local Councils' agenda, and I believe it should be on Parish and Town Council's agendas to encourage residents and property owners to take this into consideration as they make choices for their own properties, gardens and transport options. Currently, ground water levels are high; rivers are in full flow too, so heavy rain could tip into flooding. Boggy gardens are a problem, but household flooding is much more serious,

especially if polluted.

We hear a lot about polluted water spilling out into rivers, but in heavy rain, SW report that up to 96% of the water through the sewage pipes can be clean rainwater, which shouldn't be there! Please check that your rainwater pipes are not connected to your sewage system: this may have happened before you moved in. And please check the ditch and drain outside your home is clear so the water flows away. Use the 'report it' tab on hants.gov.uk to report blocked drains and pipes. Leaflets with further information available online on hants.gov.uk, or contact me for a paper copy.

2025 started with significant changes proposed to the organisation of Local Government.

The start of the process is the decision for creation of a Mayor for the Strategic authority. On the 10th January, All four HIPS Councils (Hampshire, Isle of Wight, Portsmouth and Southampton Councils) submitted a proposal to Government for the 'fast track' creation of a Strategic Mayoralty, called the Devolution Priority Programme. **This new** mayoralty will have strategic powers (transport, skills, public health, nature recovery etc) rather than ceremonial ones. The Cabinet decision following the Council debate online can be seen at hants.gov.uk -search Cabinet (January 10th). This process *may* delay County Council elections, although I disagree with this.

If the proposal is accepted, all of the district councils and smaller unitary authorities within the HIPS area will then have to decide how they will be organised into Unitary Authorities. The 'final' new government system is unlikely to be in place before 2027. So-my County Corner will continue!

If you have gas, many of you may be experiencing Southern Gas Network disruption as they work to repair old pipes. This work is disruptive but necessary, but I have found the SGN teams happy accommodate any particular problem that you have with a closure in your area. Please make contact with them using the number on their notification letter or on the yellow signs as soon as you can.

Kings Barton works continue: the Andover Road closure is still not resolved. The 'trigger' of 650 homes is nigh, but neither Cala nor HCC are ready to sign off road and junction designs. I'll keep you posted on updates. Acorn Energy and Instavolt EV charging are poised to open at Three Maids Hill.

I'm making progress on a number of pedestrian and cycle improvements. Lack of evidence from the public means that I am struggling to stop drivers misusing bridleways. So far, just one person reports this! If you are concerned by this too, please report to the Police and let me know too.

I'm pleased that despite budget restrictions, I have confirmation that a number of Rights of Way works across the division are continuing: preparation for Nuns Walk improvements have started (by 2027 earliest), the cycle path from Harestock Water Treatment to Wellhouse Lane will be done this Spring, Bishops Sutton to Long Barn path improvements due in June 2025, and a tarmac cycle link on the Barton path under the mainline railway this year. We have a date of summer 2026 for long awaited West Street improvements (first requested 2009!) and there is now a costed solution for the Andover Road path in Micheldever Station. By the waywatch out for exciting 'Railway 200' Events this year!

Meanwhile the Government has announced a new fund to provide 100% fast broadband: I will be renewing efforts to link all of you into this funding along with our MP, Danny Chambers. I know from your comments that this affects not just rural areas, but pockets of the towns and villages too.
