

# **The Traveller**

Fourteenth-century England is a hard place to live. The few inhabitants of Chilton Candover have lived through war and famine. Those who saw the 1320s may even remember the terrible pestilence which laid low their cattle.

But today, a lone traveller is riding down the road. He wears a long robe and a hood, pulled across his face to shield him from the drizzle. In his satchel he carries an important document: instructions for the local clergy, bearing a heavy lead seal that marks the instructions as having come from the papal court to whom kings, bishops and cardinals are all subject. In this deeply religious society, introspective after the ravages of disease and starvation, the pope matters.

The document is delivered, acted on and subsequently spends years on a stone shelf in the church of St Nicholas. Baptisms, weddings and funerals happen around it. The world, and Chilton Candover, moves on. Politics change.

But one day, the papal document is moved. Perhaps it is lost, or maybe the Reformation – which sees thousands such documents furiously thrown from the archives – reaches the village. But on that day, the lead bulla is taken across the very road it arrived on and tossed into a field. Once powerful, it is now worthless.

And it is forgotten – until an autumn day in 2024.

As a metal detectorist and archaeologist finding any historically interesting item is incredibly rewarding, especially if it has local significance.

This bulla, found in a local field, is a seal which would have been attached to a papal document (bulls), giving it papal authenticity. Bullae were thus legally binding. The front of the bulla shows the issuing Pope's name and the reverse shows St Peter and St Paul. This one originated in Avignon, issued by Clement VI. Clement was a Francophile and chose to remain in his country, but most bullae would have started their journey in Rome.

Pope Clement was expected to be not just a clergyman but a diplomat, with kings and cardinals answering to him. He had many challenges throughout his papacy but managed to

lead a life filled with what he loved, art and music. His good nature shone through during the plague when he continued to hear the confessions of the sick and dying. Incredibly he didn't become ill himself. From the decrees he issued, two were far-reaching and the bulla is likely to have been attached to one of them.

<u>Firstly,</u> following his choice of residency away from Rome Clement needed a diplomatic move and so decreed that a jubilee be held every 50 years, starting in 1350. This would effectively take him back to Rome whilst the jubilee (a pilgrimage for the remission of sins) was in progress. Jubilees are still practiced today.

<u>Secondly</u>, having witnessed the devastation of the Black Death first-hand he took action to protect the Jews. People couldn't understand the origin of the pandemic, and many blamed the Jewish population. Clement issued a papal bull urging the clergy to protect them.

It is impossible not to ponder on the circumstances behind its loss, to wonder who was involved (and why), and, to consider the visual aspect of the surroundings as they were compared to now. For me it is a privilege to contribute to the history of the Candover valley.

# Walking with Wildlife, Robert Bryant

On a mild foggy morning, we were squelching along the footpath that leads up to Noar Hill, the Wildlife Trust's reserve near Selborne. A notice on the gate revealed the presence of grazing cattle, British Whites, a hardy breed of gentle character. The bridlepath here had also recently reopened, following its closure to safely clear dead and dying ash trees.

The grassy humps and hollows of the reserve were bordered by shaggy clumps of juniper trees, grey green, that hunched among thickets of dogwood stems, now a deep dark red. At first all was quiet, apart from the pinking calls of blackbirds breaking cover and flying up in alarm from the woodland edge close by. These rather twitchy thrushes were probably winter visitors flown in from northern climes. Continental male blackbirds tend to have darker bills and to lack the golden eye ring of our resident birds.

We wondered what had disturbed them when, rounding a hummock, we met a very large white cow with distinctive black ears and muzzle. She stood, head down, placidly munching the grassy crown of an anthill and was not bothered in the slightest as we strolled by. A robin, clearly very attentive, was following her every move, poised to hop over and pick up anything edible. I was reminded that robins, the gardener's friend, were historically shy woodland creatures that followed forest cattle. Looking up we noticed another British White, a companion cow, standing some distance farther back, busily rummaging through the undergrowth.

Leaving them to their valuable conservation work we strode on, tramping upwards along muddy paths pitted with heavy hoofprints. Since our last visit, there had been a good deal of coppicing of the high hazel, now put to creative use with cut branches woven to form a variety of fences and hurdles.

Taking a break, we sat on the new oak bench at the top of the reserve, sipping coffee and nibbling chocolate brownie bought from the Candover Valley Stores. Glancing up, we saw a magnificent red kite floating leisurely overhead.

#### On the Farm—Julian Gibbons

Happy New Year to you all and I hope your New Year hopes and dreams come true. Those of the farming industry are quite extensive at the moment, and that is before we start on politics.

We split between those who are hoping not to live past the end of the next tax year and those who need to keep healthy for a minimum of 7 years all in the name of tax planning.

Fortunately, we have bought all our nitrogen fertilizer for this coming spring, because we are having a £50/tonne tax applied to all imported nitrogen fertiliser. The aim is to apply a carbon tax to imports to reflect their true cost to society. What it will mean is that imported urea which is 46% nitrogen will become even cheaper when compared to ammonium nitrate that is only 34.5% nitrogen but has a much lower carbon footprint. This is because the tax is applied per tonne not based on nitrogen content. Our own UK produced ammonium nitrate will rise in price, even though it isn't taxed because it's price is based on the price of imports. We lost half our UK production when one of the two factories closed due to the high energy costs in the UK, so we have to import far more then historically we used to.

If you are fed up with the run of weather we have had for the last 18 months, hope may be at hand. The El Nino effect that we have had causing havoc in global weather is coming to an end so we should get a change in the weather for a bit. We regularly get these El Nino years, but the run of weather we have had since the summer of 2023 has been the most challenging, I can remember. We look back fondly on the summer of 2022 with those lovely dry days.

Last month's storm Darragh, brought a bit of tree damage. The most significant was a large beech at Burkham snapping off and taking out the 33Kv line to the Preston Candover substation. With unusual foresight SSE networks put in a second line in the early 2000s to take the pressure off the first line. This comes south of Bradley and was probably the reason we weren't out for power for days. An outside team arrived at Burkham with tracked vehicles replaced a series of snapped poles, changed the isolators on the surviving poles and left leaving less damage to the fields then we had feared.

On the farm we are going through maintenance jobs on equipment. We plan to coppice another length of hedge before spring growth starts. We could have applied for a grant towards the cost, but as these have now been cancelled it was just as well. It does give an opportunity to try to thicken up the hedge from the bottom up and we've been pleased with the results from previous years.

Spring crops have been planned and seed ordered and, in some cases, already on the farm. Final areas will depend on how the rape comes through the winter. We suspect we will lose some of it as the plants are very small. The last fields we planted all went in different ways, but none have grown well. I was persuaded to change variety at the last minute, and I think that might be one of the reasons. The seed was very small and often in the past the best established crops come from large seed with plenty of reserves. It was a reminder to stick to ones plans and if you do change, do some research.



#### **RSV Vaccination**

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is an enveloped RNA virus, in the same family as the human parainfluenza viruses and mumps and measles viruses. RSV is one of the common viruses that cause coughs and colds in winter. RSV is transmitted by large droplets and by secretions from contact with an infected person.

All eligible patients will be sent a text invitation or will receive a telephone call to invite them to a clinic for this vaccination in January/February.



#### Summary

Thick cloud trapped under high pressure brought mild, settled conditions with occasional drizzle at the start of November but the cloud eventually lifted, with the first sun on the 11<sup>th</sup>. The brighter weather lasted for a few days and temperatures remained about average with more rain before temperatures dropped on the 19<sup>th</sup> and remained low for a few days with snow flurries on the 21<sup>st</sup>. The mild weather returned with the arrival of Storm Bert on the 23<sup>rd</sup> bringing a fresh to strong breeze and 1.84 inches of rain over two days. The next storm, Storm Conall provided a further 0.90 inches overnight on the 26<sup>th</sup>. The month ended with some sunny but cooler weather and the coldest night at 24°F on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Overall, the month and season were colder and wetter than average.







#### **Incredible Umbellifers**

As we move through the colder months of the year, a hidden world of nature is revealed to us. Leaves and flowers fall away, exposing the structures beneath. Along the banks of our chalk streams, we can see strange shapes that were once cloaked in clouds of small white flowers: the dry remains of plants known as umbellifers.

The umbellifer family is very large and contains many poisonous species, but also edible ones like carrot, celery, parsnip, fennel, cumin, dill, and coriander. If you're thinking that its name sounds rather like "umbrella", then you're spot on: the two words share a common root in the Latin word for "shade" or "shadow". The family name itself comes from umbels – flower clusters that radiate out from the main stem.

In most umbellifer species, these flowers are white and bloom through the spring and summer. They usually decline as the weather grows colder, leaving dried out stems behind. But even in wintertime, umbellifers are of great value to wildlife: they provide cover when vegetation is sparse, and some insects take shelter inside their hollow stems. Let's look at some of the river-loving members of this floral family!

If you're familiar with Hampshire's history, you'll no doubt know that watercress grows in our chalk streams. But if you find some in the wild, it could be growing alongside our first umbellifer. Fool's watercress is a creeping perennial that loves stream margins and wet ditches, although it can also be found in wetlands. Unlike watercress – which is actually in the cabbage family – it smells like carrot when crushed.

Another similar-looking plant is lesser water-parsnip, which grows on damp ground or in the shallow edges of clear, flowing water. Because it spreads through stems that run over the ground, called "stolons", it can play a key role in reducing riverbank erosion. One way to identify it is by looking for a pale ring at the points where leaves branch off from the stem. True to its name, crushing it releases the scent of parsnip.

Our riverbanks are also home to hemlock water-dropwort (Oenanthe crocata) – not to be confused with the more famous hemlock (Conium maculatum), which also grows near water. Its close relative, river water-dropwort (Oenanthe fluviatilis), is more specialised; it likes clean, lowland rivers with plenty of calcium. This makes our chalk streams fantastic habitats for this species, if they're in a healthy condition.

Since many of the umbellifers look alike, some caution is needed around them. Several species are highly toxic if eaten, and some have sap that can cause skin irritation. Giant hogweed in particular can cause painful photosensitive blisters after only brief contact; this invasive species can reach a towering 5m when fully grown, but is harder to differentiate in its younger stages. If in doubt, it's best to admire from a distance.





Happy New Year!

Hampshire County

Council's Leaders are putting a brave face on life, but in truth, the County's finances are in real trouble. HCC's Medium Term Financial Strategy (MTFS) was agreed at the County Council at the end of November. It was not a decision about the Council Tax levy, but a factual financial statement to inform council tax decision making by February 2025.

During the period of austerity, central Government funding to local authorities fell by nearly 50%. The challenge now is for the HCC Cabinet to decide how to balance the books before it sets council tax for 25/26 in mid-February. You can more about the County's budget on https://www.hants.gov.uk/aboutthecouncil/budgetspendingandperformance/budgetandcounciltax and watch the council meeting live (or recorded) on www.hants.gov.uk

The financial picture is complicated, but dire. 1% on council tax raises approx. £8m. The County needs to raise an annual revenue of around £120m more than it does at present, ie: 15% council tax rise. To do this, they'd have to call a referendum as it is over 5%. The cost of a referendum is approx. £650K, adding to the burden. This financial difficulty, built up over the last decade, puts our services that we trust and expect at risk.

Drivers complain about potholes, but many of us especially worry for the provision of education and support for children and adults with special needs. Families get into difficulties for all sorts of reasons, and if the services aren't available, it's too easy to fall between the cracks, and sink rather than swim to safety. For me, this must be a priority.


